Toronto — (RNS) — A blind girl with a "seeing eye" dog was a prominent delegate attending the annual meeting of the American Catholic Philosophical Association here.

She is Dr. Clementine Wien, a professor of philosophy at Xavier College for girls, Cincinnati, Ohio. Blind as the age of 13, Dr. Wien was not daunted from pursuing her educational ambitions. By means of readers and a prodigious memory she made her way through undergraduate and graduate courses, guided in her studies by Dr. Anton C. Pegis, professor of philosophy at the University of Toronto, past president of the Association.

Labor Leader Dies; Mt. Morris Native

Detroit — (NC) — Funeral services were held at St. Mary of Redford Church here for Elmer E. Millman, international president of the A. F. of L. Brotherhood of Maintenance of Way Employees and advisor in the forming of the Detroit Archdiocesan Labor Institute.

Mr. Millman, 56, was a native of Mt. Morris, N. Y. He left college to go to work for the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad and was instrumental in organizing his fellow workers on a section gang. He served as secretary-treasurer of the Maintenance of Way Brotherhood from 1922 to 1940, when he was elected president.

The Rev. Raymond Clancy, director of the Detroit Archdiocesan Labor Institute, delivered the sermon at the Requiem Mass and described Mr. Millman's years of service to his fellow men. The priest declared that the most successful of all labor leaders are those who do not seek private gain.

Deny Germans Title Cards

Frankfurt — (RNS) — The general ruling of the Inter-Allied Control Commission in Berlin which prohibits the mailing of "picture cards" from abroad to Germany, has been interpreted in such a way that Christmas cards too remain excluded.

What harm such holiday greetings could do, especially since all mail from abroad to Germany is censored, remains a mystery. Certainly this restriction is not in line with the new policy opposing the "hate the Germans" slogan so widely applied since the war by all the occupational authorities.

In a recent column we were in error when we stated that a veteran who did not take out National Service Life Insurance while in the service could not do so at this time. Men and women who served in Armed Forces may take out NSLI now as a new proposition or a renewal providing they hold a discharge other than dishonorable.

Q.—A veteran writes that he was separated from the service with a discharge other than honorable. He does not mention which branch of the service he served in, but asks what, if anything, can be done to have his present discharge changed?

A.—If you honestly believe that your discharge is unjust and is not fair in view of your service, or is too severe for your wrong you are entitled to apply for review. We suggest you have both sides of your discharge photostated and mail the photostats to us with complete details pertaining to your case. We will keep your confidence, but prepare for an application for a review of your discharge and Mr. Eugene Taggart of the CWW Washington Bureau, will represent you before the Board of Review and endeavor to have your present discharge cancelled and an honorable discharge issued in its place. There will be no cost or obligation whatever to you.

Q.—A disabled vet would like to obtain a Federal Civil Service job and asks where he can secure a list of job openings and other data?

A.—Position information and application blanks may be obtained at the Civil Service office at any first and second class Post Office. Other data is posted on the bulletin boards at these offices.

Q.—This vet applied for his terminal leave pay in September and while the certified copies of his discharge have been returned, he has not received his bond. He asks why he has not received his bond?

A.—Forwarding of these bonds have been delayed due to a technicality which has been cleared up. They will be in the mail soon.

Q.—The widow of a World War I veteran states that her pension was terminated when she remarried. Her second husband recently passed on and she inquires if she may now have the pension reinstated?

A.—It can not be done. When a widow's pension is discontinued because of remarriage, the pension cannot thereafter be reinstated according to the law. This also applies to the remarriage of the widows of World War II veterans.

Q.—A vet's wife asks why the veteran organizations supported the bill placing a ceiling of \$200 a month on the salary plus pension income of married vets who have returned to college?

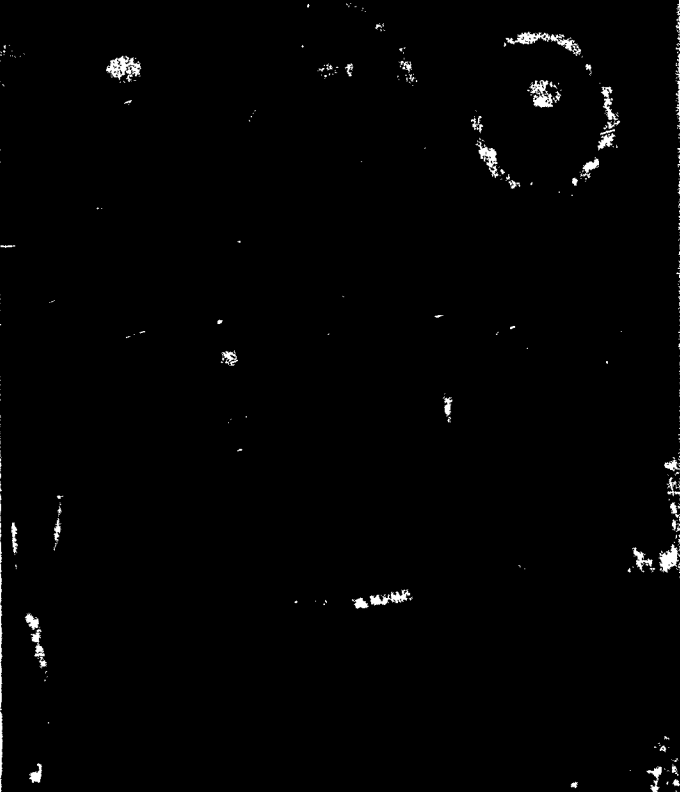
A.—To the best of our knowledge no veteran group endorsed this bill. At present CWW is asking the members of the 80th Congress to repeal this particular amendment contending it is a breach of faith. All other national vet organizations are supporting us in this request. You can help by writing to your U. S. Senators and Member of Congress endorsing our stand.

Veterans' Aide Deadline for War II Rights, Benefits Set

By Catholic War Veterans Service

The following is a convenient ready reference tabulation of the time-limits within which veterans and their survivors and dependents are entitled to exercise certain rights, benefits and privileges to which they are entitled by federal laws. We recommend that you keep these dates handy. Should you wish additional copies of same may be had in mimeograph form, by writing to us. The important dates before cover all present existing legislation.

10 Days After Discharge: Report to local draft board.

30 Days After Discharge: Application for old job.

Until February 1, 1947: Reinstatement of National Service Life Insurance without physical examination. (After February 1, 1947 insurance may be reinstated without physical examination, provided application is made within six months of date of lapse.)

Until July 1, 1947: Application for \$1600 automobile for leg amputees.

Until July 1, 1947: Veterans discharged on or after May 12, 1945, may enlist in Enlisted Reserve Corps in same grade held at time of discharge, providing such enlistment is accomplished within 6 months of discharge, or before July 1, 1947 (whichever is later).

Until August 1, 1947: Veteran may apply for waiver of insurance premiums to which he had been entitled since August 1, 1946. After August 1, 1947, no premium will be waived which becomes due more than one year prior to receipt in the VA of application for waiver.

Until August 1, 1947: Beneficiaries of deceased servicemen, or veterans, may claim waiver of any premium which had become due to the serviceman or veteran if serviceman or veteran died during total disability, dependents also have until Aug. 1, 1947, to apply for proceeds of policy. After that date they have one year from date of death of veteran to apply.

Until September 1, 1947: Applications for terminal leave pay may be made.

Until August 1, 1948: A beneficiary who has received payment before Sept. 30, 1944, of NSLI, has the right to change option of settlement from Option One to Option Two.

Before 1950: Veterans who did not take out NSLI policies while in service, may apply for such insurance now. Those who make application before 1950 will not be denied a policy by reason of any disability incurred or aggravated in service.

Before 1950: Veteran applying for total disability insurance coverage, will not be denied such because of any service-incurred injury or disability if he applies before 1950.

2 Years After Discharge: Eligible for Readjustment Allowances under War End of War Bill.

4 Years After Discharge: Eligible to initiate Educational Rights Under (or end of war) whichever is later: G. I. Bill, or Public Law No. 16, vocational readjustment.

5 Years After Taking Out National Service Life Insurance (if term of policy dated after Jan. 1, 1946): Conversion Privilege to permanent policies.

5 Years After End Of War: All Readjustment Allowances end.

8 Years After Taking Out NSLI (if term policy dated before Jan. 1, 1946): Conversion Privilege to permanent policies.

9 Years After End Of War: G. I. Education must be completed.

10 Years After End Of War: Rights to apply for Loan Guar-

MRP HAS 2 SEAT EDGE ON REDS IN UPPER HOUSE

Paris — (NC) — The Popular Republican Movement (MRP), the French Christian democratic party, scored another triumph when it announced the largest number of seats in the voting to determine the distribution of 244 out of 318 seats in the Council of the Republic, upper house of the new French Parliament.

Distribution of the seats will be as follows: 63 for the MRP, 61 for the Communists, 37 for the Socialists, 25 for the Radicals, 21 for the Moderates and 7 for the Algerian Mohammedans. These figures point up to a defeat for the Marxist bloc of socialists and communists who will have only 98 seats as against 100 for the non-Marxist parties, while the Mohammedans will have seven.

Earlier in the voting the MRP achieved a notable victory when the departments which elected 147 councilors on a single ballot gave 48 seats to the MRP, 13 to the Communists and only 12 to the Socialists, 13 to the Radicals and 18 to the Moderates and conservatives. However, the complicated system of proportional representation which applied to the distribution of the seats of the other 73 councilors narrowed the MRP's margin of victory.

The upper house of the new Parliament will finally have 115 members. 51 were members in 1946, 10 were named by the French colonial territories and another 50 will be elected by the National Assembly. (Press reports indicate the entire Council will probably have been elected by December 24.)

Another indication of the strength of the MRP was that the party received 41 per cent of the votes cast by the electors chosen at the polls by the French populace several weeks ago. This constitutes a higher proportion of the votes than has been attained by any party up to now.

"Not at end of war it is said to be set by Congress as Presidential proclamation. But end of war will not occur for enlisted in Regular branches of armed forces until expiration of their enlistment under Voluntary Re-enlistment Act of 1945. If such re-enlistment has occurred prior to Oct. 6, 1945, then G. I. rights continue for men inducted or enlisting after that date, but "eligibility after" is calculated only as active service time from date of induction or enlistment until officially declared "end of war."

Scientists Stress Research Needs of Catholic Colleges

Washington — (RNS) — Until the scientific facilities of Catholic colleges and universities are adequate to the point where some teaching personnel do not have to leave to seek better facilities to research, they will not be able to secure the immediate growth from government and private industry now available to American institutions of higher learning.

This was the last warning made by a number of the presenters from 24 Catholic colleges and universities at the Catholic Research Council of Science, meeting here during the afternoon session of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

The Council in question met over a 3-day period from Nov. 29 to Dec. 1, 1946, at the Hotel Statler, New York City. The meeting was the first of its kind since the war, and was the first time that Catholic colleges and universities had a voice in the scientific research community.

The Council was organized by the American Association for the Advancement of Science, which is a non-profit, non-sectarian organization devoted to the promotion of scientific research and the advancement of science in general.
