

Pope's Anti-Clericalism Fight Supported in Boston

Boston — (RNS) — In a message to Pope Pius XII, Archbishop of Boston, Richard J. Cushing, of the Boston Archdiocese, has pledged the prayers of the million Catholics of the archdiocese to aid the Pontiff in checking anti-clericalism in Rome and throughout the world.

The message said: "The Archbishop, priests, and the people of the Archdiocese of Boston, profoundly moved by the recent plea of Your Holiness to the Catholics of Rome, unite with you in ardent prayer that God may strengthen His people against the malicious intrigues of the irreligious in Rome itself and elsewhere throughout the world.

"Hatred for sacred things is contagious and so, to resist the

international common front of those who malign the Church, the Archdiocese of Boston pledges a solidarity of our million Catholics in a common front of prayer that infidelity may be checked."

Pulpit Supplemented by Growing Number of Parish Publications

Parochial publications, many with circulations of over 1000, are keeping Rochester Diocesan Catholics well-informed on the national and local news.

Parish newspapers, bulletins and announcements, a large number of which are published regularly each week have become a common service throughout the Diocese in the last few years. Edited for the most part by the busy pastor and his assistants, the parochial organs are thought to be filling a long felt need within the parishes.

Largest in size of these publications is "The Parish Weekly,"

compiled each week by priests of Blessed Sacrament parish, Rochester, of which the Rev. Thomas F. Connors is pastor.

With a weekly circulation of nearly 2,000 copies, "The Parish Weekly" is growing rapidly and according to a recent announcement will be increased in size during 1947.

The Blessed Sacrament paper is printed folio style on glossy 6x9 inch paper. Number of pages varies according to the quantity of news usually running 10 or more.

Established in 1934, the weekly carries parish notes, schedule

of services, altar boy appointments and tabulations of collections as well as editorials and reprinted articles.

Among its features are columns written by the parish priests, the Reverend Fathers John Morgan, Francis J. Fegnam and Thomas J. Manley.

Corpus Christi Church, which is the parish of the Rt. Rev. Mgr. William M. Hart, vicar general of the diocese, has the oldest parish publication in the diocese.

"The Corpus Christi Bulletin," a good-sized printed booklet, was started back in 1923, and through the years has been supplying parishioners with important and interesting information.

The Rev. Roy B. Murphy, Rev. Thomas F. McVeigh and Rev. John D. Malley assist Monsignor Hart in editing the bulletin, which enjoys a weekly circulation of 1,500 copies.

A fairly recent newcomer to the publishing world is the "Parish News" of Sacred Heart Pro-Cathedral, a four-page mimeographed folder with the same general characteristics as the other two parish papers. Started in 1944, its weekly circulation also averages 1,500. The Rt. Rev. Mgr. George V. Burns, pastor, is director.

Another largely circulated bulletin is the "Announcements" of St. Monica's Church, where the Rt. Rev. Mgr. William F. Fegnam, diocesan chancellor, is pastor. An average of 2,000 copies of this printed folder have been distributed each week since the first issue in April, 1946.

St. Mary's Church of Auburn, pastored by the Rev. Dr. William E. Cowan, is among the Eastern Tier parishes with a widely distributed parish bulletin. Also one of the older publications, the "Parish Bulletin" was begun in 1930. It circulates about 1,000 copies regularly.

Some 1,000 copies of the St. Andrew's "Parish Digest" have been given out each week for the past two years of the paper's existence. The "Digest" is a compact mimeographed sheet.

Among other city parishes with regular publications are Holy Apostles, with an average circulation of 800; St. Anne's Shrine Bulletin, also 800; St. Bridget's "Briefcase," 700; St. Theodore's "Chronicle."

One notable new addition to the list of town diocesan publications is "The Patriarch," St. Patrick's Church, Macedon, "Wayne County's Only Sunday Paper." This new, mimeographed sheet is the work of the Rev. Bernard C. Hanna, pastor.

Other out of town bulletins are the St. Alphonsus, Auburn, "Bulletin," circulating 900 copies; Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Brockport, "Sidelights," 500; St. Peter and Paul, Elmira, 600; Immaculate Conception, Hudson, "Holy Name Bulletin," 700; St. Patrick, McLennan, "The Patriarchian," St. Mary's of the Lake, Watkins Glen, "Bulletin," 350.

Another outstanding job of newspaper publishing is being done by "The Catholic Advocate," Holy Name Society monthly of St. Joseph's Ukrainian Church, Rochester.

Edited by Charles Bastuk, the mimeographed "Advocate" carries every type of parish social item including marriages, deaths, and births in addition to news of the parish school, societies, veterans, and the like. Sections are also devoted to sports, personal items and editorials.

During recent months, many interesting articles explaining the Ukrainian rites and church customs have been featured.

"The Advocate" has its own photographer and is freely illustrated.
