

Assumptions Five Victors Over Assumption High

Assumption High School of Windsor, Canada, managed a 40-35 victory in an overtime hockey game against the Assumption High School of Windsor, Canada, today to give a 4-0-2 record to a powerful Cornell team.

In an exciting battle at the Sports Arena, Assumption's fast breaking attack proved too much for the Victors of Assumption as the maroon jerseys dropped seven points through the netting against a single field goal by their opponents in the overtime session.

The first quarter saw the Irish surge ahead as Assumption became acquainted with the large court. The Wrightmen seemed to be on fire as they led by as much as 14 points at one time in the second quarter and left the court at half time on the long road of a 20-14 count. The Cornell team showed that they were not to be taken lightly as they scored 11 and 9 points apiece for their half's total but sparked the maroons to the ten point half time margin.

Assumption gradually narrowed the margin as it came back from its rest and drew up to a 30-20 deficit at the third quarter whistle. After his exchange of baskets Assumption's defense dropped to a nearly impenetrable level in the fourth quarter with some minutes left to play in the regulation time.

Talente put Assumption ahead as he scored a long one, but Ellis countered to even the score again. Assumption missed a free throw as the time ran out throwing the game into a 30-25 tie.

Shannon, Talente and Smith continued to give Assumption some points and the game as Assumption's Ellis was the only one to score for the Victors. Ellis with seven points followed by Pabony's six as points were high for Assumption while Shannon, Talente and Dennis shared the honors for Assumption.

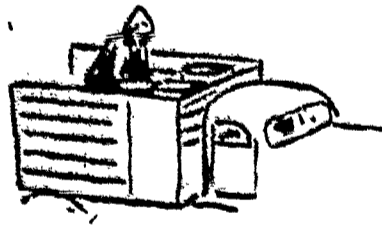
Loss to Cornell
