Plea from Japan for Orphan Aid Heard by Mercy Students

Students and graduates of Our Lady of Mercy High School have joined forces in a campaign to alleviate suffering and hardship in an orphanage in Osaka, Japan, adopted by Jean Helen Heglin, an alumna.
Mrs. Heglin, whose husband is an army doctor stationed in Japan, visited the orphanage with her two children. The things she saw there prompted a letter of appeal to Mercy's charity.
"Honestly," she wrote, "I'm working on the rationing situation and I can't see how I can help. The orphanage is run by a French Sister of Charity who also has charge of a hospital. They have about 50 orphans under their care now and numbers are increasing daily with desperate babies.
Describing the hospital as "a hell hole," Mrs. Heglin drew a realistic picture of the conditions.
He conducted a lunch room in the school and was prominent in the old Irish Minstrels as a tenor soloist. Of late years he has operated a store at Pearl St. and Averill Ave. near Monroe High School.
Besides his wife, Evelyn Hall Weber, he leaves one daughter, Mrs. Adrian Durkin.

"Through the ages, man has attempted to give God a home worthy of His dignity and today you too are handing over to God this historic old church which was conceived and built years ago by priests and hard working people.
"In order to build on this spot a home for God, your forebears plunged recklessly and fearlessly into debt. They were hopeful that your generation would see the completion of their dream.
"This day proves that you have met your responsibility and have matched the spirit of the pioneers who started this church.
"It is fitting that today we give to the Holy Family a home exclusively its own. With no debt on it and no claim on it, this church is now truly God's home."
