Industry, Labor Stands Presented at Forum

Labor-management difficulties will lessen during the coming year as "intelligent leaders" of both groups continue to gain greater understanding of each others' problems. This conclusion was reached before the Holy Name Society of Holy Trinity Church at its January meeting, in a forum conducted by two members of the R. of C. Catholic Speakers Bureau — Howard M. Woods, who presented the side of management, and John J. Scully, who outlined labor's position. Woods, an attorney for several corporations who was introduced as "a friend of labor," urged a "middle course" in industrial relations and asserted that intelligent management fully recognizes the rights of labor but insists that labor leadership equally recognize its responsibilities. He condemned undermanned and Communist domination which he asserted exists in many unions, and declared that management always is ready to deal with democratically represented union leaders. It was his opinion that some of management should "open its books" and tell the true financial picture to labor to avoid the "strike."
