Church Leaders Hail Bible Radio Series

Enthusiastic endorsement by religious leaders of many faiths has resulted from the previewing of a new public service radio program, "The Greatest Story Ever Told," which will be heard at 8:30 p. m. (EST) each Sunday over the coast-to-coast network of the American Broadcasting Company. The opening program last Sunday was a dramatization of the life of the Good Samaritan. Conceived and written under the supervision of Fulger O'Conor, Catholic convert, and senior editor of the Readers' Digest, prominent Protestant, Catholic and Jewish churchmen have been invited during the past several weeks to listen to and comment on advance recordings of the program.

Rev. Msgr. Joseph A. Nelson, Vicar for Religious in the Archdiocese of New York, said: "I approve this project wholeheartedly. If this proposed presentation can be done each week as it has been done today, it is a most wonderful opportunity. Few, if any, will be more welcomed at this time by millions of people."

The series can serve as an anchor, preventing souls from going astray upon the rocks of bias, ideas and distorted action. If the Divine Personality of Christ, and His teachings are presented through this dramatic method, as faithfully as they were revealed through the Sacred Scripture, millions of minds will see the light of the God-Man's life which is Truth and will yield to its refining influence for the betterment of the nation."

**Pope Asks Prayers
For China Missions**

New York — (INC) — Directing an appeal to the nation's Catholics to join with His Holiness

Pope Pius XII in his February missive intended for the "success of the Chinese Missions under present conditions," Msgr. Thomas J. McDonnell, national director of The Society for the Propagation of the Faith, declared in a statement that "the Holy See realizes the dangers which confront the people and missions in that unhappy land" and is fully aware "of the activities which are being conducted beyond the iron curtain of the Russiandominated territories."

The statement reminds that the missionaries stood shoulder to shoulder with the Chinese in their long years of the Sino-Japanese struggle; and that the present excesses, which include confiscation of Church property, trials by ecclesiastical courts and banishments of bishops and priests into exile, have only intensified the determination of missionaries to carry out their work in the land now torn by internal strife.

Belgian Catholic Paper Marks 100th Jubilee

Antwerp, Belgium — (INC) —

Although two years late, a century of publication has been celebrated here by His Handelblad, Catholic daily. Circumstances beyond the control of the publishers — namely, the war — made it impossible to hold the celebration sooner.

The paper began at a time when anti-Catholic leftists controlled the Belgian parliament in 1887 when the leftists began riots with the slogan, "Down with the converts," the paper became a Catholic daily and since that time has been a staunch defender of Catholic rights. During both World War I and II, publication of the paper was suspended, each time upon the cessation of hostilities, the staff gathered again and publication was resumed.

Priest Once Thought Dead Named Head of Seminary

Shanghai — (NC) — The Rev. Yves Neige, S.J., Shanghai mission superior who started his

comrade here by reappearing from the hinterlands while they were preparing to offer a Neigean Mass for him, has now been named rector of the Bishop's Seminary at suburban Zikawei.

The story of the journey which resulted in Father Neige's "death" is as follows: After hearing of the murder of two Chinese Sisters at Lienshan he obtained a communist commander's pass and went to the city to investigate. He was arrested outside Lienshan, and though his captors admitted the Sisters were dead, they would not allow him to investigate the church premises.

He was subsequently taken under communist escort to the town of Fleming, where he was held in mild captivity for about two months, until the place was captured by national troops, who set him free. During his

imprisonment he had written many letters, but none ever came out of the communists' held territory. The report of his death was released following the questioning of Chinese witnesses by French priest.
