Father Meade Named Niagara U. President

Niagara — The Very Rev. Joseph M. Neenan, C.M., president of Niagara University, has been succeeded by the Very Rev. Francis J. Meade, C.M., it was announced here by the Very Rev. Daniel M. Leahy, professor of the Eastern province of the Vincentian Fathers.

university in 1928 as a professor

of philosophy and education. He

was ordained in the priesthood in

Philadelphia's St. Peter and

Paul cathedral by Msgr. Cardinal

Dougherty, then an auxiliary

on May 29, 1928. He celebrated his silver jubilee in the priesthood at Niagara two years ago.

After his ordination, Father

Meade completed post-graduate

work at St. Joseph's college,

Princeton, N. J., and in 1931 was

appointed prefect of that college.

In 1931 and 1932 he served with

the Vincentian Fathers' foreign

mission band at Kanchow, Ki-

ang, China. Returning to Ger-

mantown, Pa., the central house

of the Vincentians in the East

ern province, he was named as

assistant director of the Miraculous

Medal association. From 1933 to

1935 he served with the mission

band at Bangor, Pa., coming

from that assignment to Niagara.
