Washington, (NC) — It is the slow but certain recovery of the mission work of the Church in Europe, a report from the Paris mother house of the Holy Ghost Fathers has been received at their provincial residence here.

Signs in Washington point to the United States taking a firm stand. Edwin W. Pauley, American representative commissioner with the rank of ambassador, has indicated in a public address in this city that the United States will resist any demand that German industrial output be raised for the purpose of providing reparations from that country's current production.

Pauley, whose remarks were taken to have the endorsement of President Truman and Secretary of State Marshall, said the United States "would not object to the Soviets taking reparations from current production if certain pre-requisites are met." One of these, he said, is "that there are first removed from Germany the plants designed specifically to make war materials."
