This was the initial premise of a talk given by Joseph Gervais, Rochester attorney for the Parish Credit Unions before the Catholic Worker Group at St. Joseph's House of Hospitality, 402 South Ave.

"Christian Charity," he said, "is the virtue by which we love God for His own sake and love our neighbor as ourselves for the love of God. Charity is not, therefore, merely a specific act, it is, rather, the virtue which must inform all our actions. Modern Big Business which has as its force the private profit system almost compels everyone to work for himself alone."

"There is a technique of doing business in which Christian Charity can be practiced. This special way of doing business is the Co-operative Movement."

Mr. Gervais spoke on the Credit Unions which he said are the extension of the co-op movement into the field of finance. He explained the success of the Parish Credit Unions as operated in four Rochester parishes.
