Abp. Rummel Backs Anti-Gambling Drive

New Orleans—Enforcement of Louisiana's anti-gambling laws is clearly the duty of public officials of the state, the Most Rev. Joseph F. Rummel, Archbishop of the Catholic Archdiocese of New Orleans, declared here.

The Archbishop's statement was made in response to a telegram from the Rev. A. C. Lawton, state director of the Legion of Moral and Civic Foundation, which followed a state-wide move of Protestant ministers to press execution of Louisiana's

gambling laws are the same as all forms of legislation and enjoy no special privileges of exemption subject to local custom or the attitude of individual officials, the Archbishop said.

Regulation or control for the good of the people must come through the lawfully constituted courts, he explained.

With regard to civic action, the Archbishop stated that a civic group can help in making pub-

lic officials realize their responsibilities but such an organization must be composed of a wide-ranging representation and not limited to a particular group, even a ministerial group, no matter how influential.

"Among the members of such a civic organization there should be representatives of all classes of citizens who enjoy the prestige of leadership in their respective communities," he said.

"Their action, in order to command respect and guarantee satisfactory results, must be supported by first-class legal counsel, first-class evidence, affidavits and witnesses whose testimony would be unimpeachable in a court of justice.

The Roman Catholic Church is at all times on the side of law and order, ready to condemn moral and social evil in every form, but the enforcement of laws enacted to eradicate evil that subvert public welfare and morality is clearly the function of civil administration and legal authority.

"This applies to the situation now existing in our state and to any other situation that may arise," the Archbishop said.

Mysore, India — (NC) — Maharaja Chamaraja Wodiyar, Ruler of Mysore, speaking at the solemn opening of St. Philomena's Catholic College here, said "it gives me great pleasure to be present here and to associate myself with the birth of an institution which I am confident will play a prominent part in the life of the people of my State."

Bishop Renato Fouga of Mysore, built the college with the permission of the Maharaja, who donated the ground and encouraged the enterprise by furnishing substantial funds.
