Auburn Knights Jubilee Plans Go Through Despite Heavy Fire Loss in Home

Auburn — Undeterred by a fire which completely gutted the east wing of their home, 168 Genesee St., members of Auburn Council are completing plans for marking its Golden Jubilee on Sunday, March 8.

Most Rev. James E. Keasey, Bishop of Rochester, will be principal speaker and honored guest at the dinner in Osborne Hotel at 7 p.m.

The Jubilee celebration will begin Sunday morning, when the Knights will receive Holy Communion with the Holy Name Society of their respective parishes.

Church Services set

The Knights will meet at 3:15 p.m. at the K. of C. home later in the day from where they will march in a body to St. Mary's Church. Rev. E. Leo McNamee, assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church, will impart Solemn Benediction at 6 p.m.

From St. Mary's the knights will go to the Osborne Hotel for the anniversary dinner.

The blaze which destroyed the wing of the Knights' home was discovered at 6:27 a.m. Feb. 27.

Cause was attributed by chief James Doyle of the Auburn Fire Department to defective wiring.

The east wing housed the kitchen and dining room on the basement level, social and card rooms on ground floor and ping pong room. Trustees and Secretary's office on the second floor.

Records, Furniture Saved

Workers had been busy all day Wednesday of last week laying a new floor in the social room from which new furniture purchased only two weeks ago had been removed to the west wing and escaped damage. Files and records in the second floor office were saved by firemen and were undamaged.

Grand Knight Secaur was on the scene shortly after firemen arrived and remained until late in the afternoon.

The regular meeting of the Council scheduled for last Thursday evening was moved to the Chamber of Commerce Building, three doors east and was largely attended.

While the loss of half of their home was a stunning blow to the large and active council about to observe its Golden Jubilee, members lost no time after the fire had been appraised in readying the undamaged west wing for occupancy.

Knights Clean Up

All day Saturday, a large group of Knights were busy moving furniture, sweeping and mopping under direction of Trustee Clary Hoey. By late afternoon all was in readiness for reopening.

Grand Knight Secaur and other members were loud in their praise for the excellent work of the Auburn Fire Department in confining the blaze to the east wing.

Officers and members of Auburn Council expressed deep gratitude to the many social and fraternal organizations which so promptly offered use of their facilities to the Knights of Columbus.
