

ST. JEROME'S REJOICE OVER COURT TROPHY



St. Jerome's 5 Wins Parochial Tourney Title

Defeating St. Francis of Assisi, 20 to 24, St. Jerome's quint of East Rochester won the Parochial School Basketball Tournament in a closely-contested struggle, Sunday afternoon at Aquinas Institute.

The East Rochester five was awarded the Rochester Council Knights of Columbus trophy by John T. Nottingale, Youth Activities chairman of the K. of C. The Rev. Robert Meng accepted for the champions.

Council Harry Wright of Aquinas assisted by Zimmer of this year's Irish court five handled the tournament games as officials. The tournament was sponsored jointly for the first time by Aquinas Institute and the Knights of Columbus. The Rev. Cyril Carter, C.S.B., and the Rev. Paul F. Petrey, C.S.B., represented Aquinas in the arrangements.

Third place in the tourney was won by Holy Redemptor school's representatives who defeated the Blessed Sacrament five 28 to 14.

In the semifinal, Saturday night, St. Jerome's outplayed the Blessed Sacrament quint, 12 to 9 and St. Francis of Assisi won the other game by overcoming Holy Redemptor quint, 30 to 20.

Friday night's elimination contests resulted in these scores: Holy Redemptor 30, St. Francis Xavier, 28, in a double overtime contest; St. Jerome's 27, Holy Rosary 10; Blessed Sacrament 22 and St. Stanislaus 16.
