Funeral services for Sister De la Salle Murphy of the Congregation of the Sisters of Saint Joseph, who died in St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, Friday, April 11, 1947 were held in Holy Family Chapel of Nazareth Convent on Monday at 9 o'clock.

Solemn Mass of Requiem was celebrated by the Rev. Donald J. Murphy assisted by the Rev. Edward V. Geck, Deacon, and the Rev. John M. Duffy, Subdeacon. The Rev. Edward Lintz was Master of Ceremonies and the Rev. William Shannon and the Rev. James Collins were readers. His Excellency, the Most Reverend James E. Keane, D.D. was present in the sanctuary and gave the blessing at the close of the service.

Card, Stritch Gives Bells to Catholic U.
Washington — (NC) — His Eminence Samuel Cardinal Stritch, Archbishop of Chicago and a member of the board of trustees of the Catholic University of America, has presented the university with a set of Schumierich carillon bells, which will be installed in McMillan Hall on the campus at cornment later this month. Margaret J. McCormick, pastor of the university, has announced. Ultimately the bells will be placed in the campanile of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception when that edifice on the university campus is completed.

The Schumierich carillon bells can be installed in a limited space and do not require any elaborate structural housing. They may be played either automatically or from a compact keyboard. Consisting of 23 bells, chromatically scale, their weight is only 200 pounds.
