Marshall and John Foster Dulles, a U. S. adviser.

QUEBEC YOUTH TO BOYCOTT PRAGUE MEET

Montreal (AP) — Eighteen youth organizations in the Province of Quebec have joined in refusing to send delegates to the "World Festival of Youth," scheduled for Prague this summer.

They assert the session will be dominated by Communism, with a long range objective of seeking representation in the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization as a consultative member speaking for world youth.

The Canadian group charged that the Youth Festival is an outgrowth of the World Youth Conference held in London in 1945 which resulted in the organization of the World Federation of Democratic Youth.

When an executive committee of 13 members was chosen, the Canadians say, eight Communists were named.

Although it was not represented at the London conference, the Province of Quebec had three Communists present. They claimed that 260 of 445 delegates were Communists and that half of the delegates from the United States were Communists.

In reporting on the makeup of the forthcoming session, the Quebec signatories said that the Christian youth organizations of France, Belgium and Switzerland have obtained from participation in the festival has been repudiated by 76 youth organizations in England, Poland, Yugoslavia, Ukrainian and other youth organizations operating behind the iron curtain have accepted invitations if it is said.

Fr. Parsons Hits House Labor Bill

Washington (AP) — A Catholic University of America professor, the Rev. Wilfrid Parsons, S. J., is among a group of 58 American educators who have signed a statement characterizing the Hartley labor bill recently passed by the House of Representatives as "a savage and unprovoked attack upon organized labor."

The House bill is not principally directed at the correction of labor abuses, the educators stated. "It would virtually abolish national unions by forbidding collective bargaining on other than a local basis save in isolated cases."

Law by injunction judges would be reestablished, the educators continued. "The National Labor Relations Act would be nullified. Unions would be deprived from effective political action. The bill would turn the clock back to the days of industrial autocracy."

The group expressed the hope that the Senate and President will establish a joint commission to study the underlying causes of labor unrest and prescribe remedies for proven abuses. American labor made a signal contribution to the war effort and should not be fettered with a measure which so patently denies democratic liberties.
