## Hollywood In Focus

One great movie comedian delivers a "comedy of manners" into which he plugs a "message" against the taking of human life.

Meanwhile the Hollywood dailies headline the tragic tale of an 18-year-old youth whose faith in God and trust in man so failed him that he killed the girl he professed to love most of all the people on earth.

Charles Chaplin poses as a philosopher, yet is so confused that he cannot distinguish between the sacrifice of human life in defense of right principles and callous murder for the single purpose of personal gain.

Bob Hope and Red Skelton pose as clowns with a humorous slant on "free speech," yet, by frequent lapses into crudely suggestive and cynical wisecracks, reveal their own confusion concerning the rightful use of it.

Even the radio executive stands alongside them in this respect. Whether or not it is of public importance that his personal pride and the dignity of his station be not hurt, it plainly is of great public importance that radio entertainment be kept clean. He might often have "cut" both Hope and Skelton towards that simple end.

The misguided young man who killed his girl friend, with bravado invites early death while denying the very existence of God in whose infinite mercy lies his one remaining hope.

No one in his right senses would argue that a cynic like Chaplin, or a couple of buffoons like Hope and Skelton are directly responsible for the falsification of values which leads to such appalling misdirection of human reasoning.

Yet they, together with the rest of us in strict ratio to such influence as we each may exert upon the minds of others, are indirectly responsible. There always is someone groping for a lead; looking for an example. In these times, more than ever before, immature minds are apt to turn to "the great public figures" for their answers. Many are more readily attracted by the flash of new signs, than by the glow of candlelight upon the altars.

Irresponsible critics have often blamed the movies, the radio and the newspapers for leading people astray. Sometimes they have been right; sometimes wrong. No one that I can think of, however, has ever pointed out that people who achieve fame and fortune as public idols have a positive responsibility to influence people in the right.

The movies, the radio and the press share a tremendous responsibility.

They cannot brush it aside with the airy argument that as long as they are not leading people definitely and directly astray, they are in the clear. As power-houses of national thought and behavior they have constructive functions to perform. The undeniable truth is that the movies, the radio and the press, by exploiting the inherent weaknesses of mankind, exciting physical experiences and idealizing materialistic trends are dulling the mass mind to realities which alone can help to dispel confusion.

## Catholic Boycott Urged On Theater Filming 'Outlaw'

Minneapolis (NC) — The 30,000 members of the Legion of Decency in the St. Paul Catholic archdiocese have been asked to "boycott" all future programs in the Legion theater here as a result of the theater's showing of the film, "The Outlaw."

When the chains operating the movie houses have refused to show the film at their theaters, it was booked at the Legion, which is the city's legitimate theater.
