Wisconsin Vetoes Released-Time

Madison, Wis. — By a vote of 19 to 11, the Wisconsin senate killed a bill to require local school boards to release public school pupils up to three hours each week for religious instruction off school premises. The measure had been championed by a special legislative committee as a means of combating and preventing the rising juvenile delinquency rate in the state.

Arguments against the measure were that it would promote sectarianism among school children, reduce an already shortened schedule of regular school instruction, and threaten the separation of church and state.

Vatican Will Not Appoint Successor to Abp Stepinac

Rome — (RNS) — Yugoslav authorities are still seeking some means of forcing Pope Pius XII to appoint a successor to imprisoned Archbishop Aloysius Stepinac of Zagreb. Vatican officials declared.

Interest in the fate of the Croatian primate, now serving a sentence of sixteen years at hard labor for alleged political crimes, was revived by rumors that Dr. Vladimir Bakartch, president of Croatia, has offered to force Archbishop Stepinac on condition that he leave the country immediately.
If this is true, a Vatican informant stated, it means that Belgrade is trying to force the Holy See to appoint a new archbishop in Croatia through the removal of Archbishop Stepinac. This would imply indirectly recognizing his guilt. However, as long as the archbishop remains alive, no new archbishop will be appointed to his see.

Chinese Priest Describes Plight of 7,000 Orphans

Washington — (NC) — The plight of almost 7,000 war-orphaned children in South China was told in an interview here by the Rev. Lawrence Mahan, a Portuguese priest assigned to South China. This priest said the children have been abandoned to the streets and are being taken care of in a makeshift way.

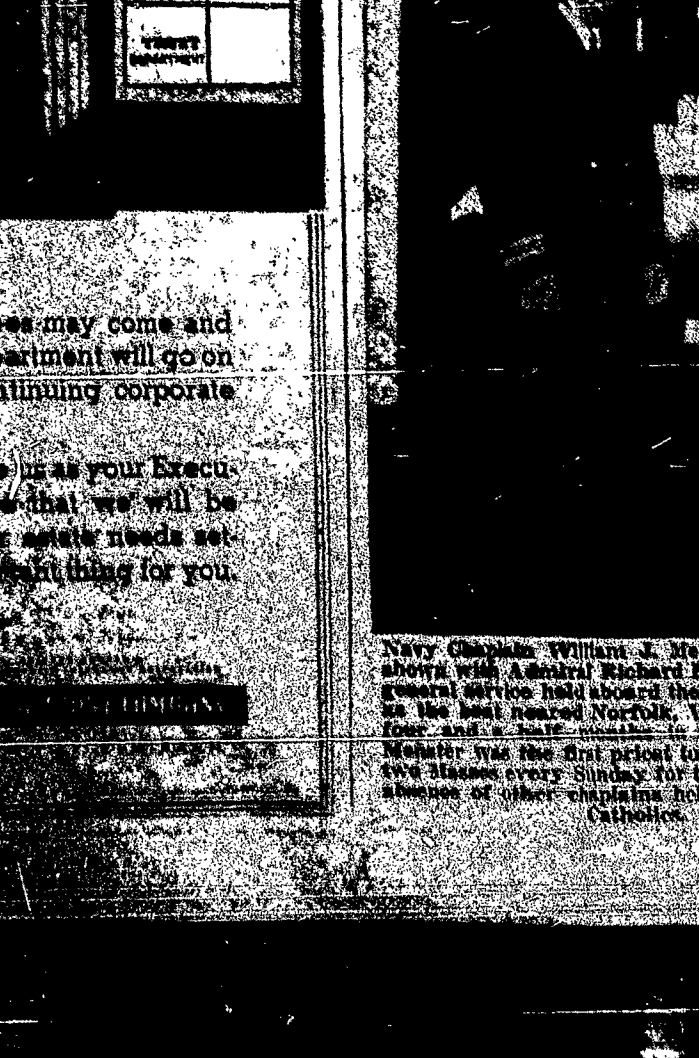
Before the war the orphanages took care of between three and four thousand children, the priest related, adding that the influx of refugees during the war years has almost doubled their charges while food has become considerably more scarce.

Father Mahan came to this country to petition aid for his starving children, he said, because he was driven to it by the thousands of innocent children crying and imploring for food. The housing shortage is so bad in Macao, a city of ordinarily about three or four hundred thousand people but swollen to over a million by war refugees, that Father Mahan has to house his orphans in two unused factories. Even rags are a luxury, he declared, adding that the only covering to be found for many of the children abandoned on the doorsteps of the orphanage are old newspapers and a bit of grass and straw.
