Children's Division Gave 80,328 days' care in foster homes to 404 children and their families. Did field work for the Diocesan Institutions Bt. Ann's Home for the Aged Gave 69,506 days' care to 239 dif-

ferent aged men and women. Cave 41,009 days' care to 172 St. Joseph's Villa of Rochester homeless, dependent and neglected children. St. Mary's Hospital - Gave 133,871 days' care and treatment to
