

Catholic War Veterans To Attend State Meet

Delegates of Monroe County Chapter, Catholic War Veterans, Inc. will go to the New York State Convention, which will be held at the County Convention Center, Albany, May 15 to 17.

Several chaplains of the various posts will accompany the lay veterans. The delegation was named at the regular monthly meeting of the county organization held in St. Andrew's parish hall. This will be the first state convention where the county organization was formed.

Resolutions adopted at the county meeting included one memorializing Congress concerning the right of paroled soldiers to share equally in any Federal aid which may be forthcoming as the result of measures now before Congress providing for Federal grants for educational purposes.

The resolution pointed out the right of such soldiers to share in that program is predicated on the fact that these soldiers have assumed, and do assume, the financial burden which education has imposed on the local government generally.

It is an obvious characteristic that to withhold such aid to these soldiers merely because they are not associated with the public school system, the resolution states.

Copies of the resolution have been forwarded to the local representatives in the House and Senate.

Lzvestia Scores Dr. Shuster

Moscow (NC) — Taking as its text a reported Vatican broadcast Lzvestia, Soviet government newspaper, has denounced directly the "extreme importance" of the reported proposal by the "Director of Hunter College of New York to raise a \$10,000,000 fund to send missionaries to Russia."

Lzvestia obviously referred to the address given to the National Catholic Education Association's convention at Boston by Dr. George N. Shuster, President of Hunter College, New York, who advocated that Catholics prepare to spend \$25,000,000 or \$30,000,000 to prepare lay experts so they can debate Communism against the Russians "in terms which Europe can understand." No where in the talk was there any reference to "missionaries to Russia."

The Vatican Radio was quoted by Lzvestia as saying: "During a meeting of teachers the director of Hunter College in New York proposed that a fund of \$30,000,000 be set up to meet the cost of sending missionaries to Russia who after several years might be able to lift the Iron Curtain and gradually get closer to the Russian people."

"One must be extremely stupid," Lzvestia said "even if one is a college director, seriously to believe that 'Russian people' need the 'civilizing services' of American missionaries hired for \$30,000,000. To proclaim such a nonsensical idea more than the limitless ignorance of this gentleman is required."
