

## New Bill Handcuffs Labor, Prelate Says

New York—(NC)—Sharp opposition to the Taft-Hartley labor legislation in Congress was voiced by Archbishop Robert E. Lucey of San Antonio, speaking over the American Broadcasting Company network. He declared that some Congressmen view the differences between labor and management as a "fight for spoils and believe that to make it a fair fight, labor must be handcuffed."

The broadcast was made under the auspices of the American Federation of Labor, speaking with Archbishop Lucey were the Rev. Malcolm V. Nash, editor of "Christianity and Civilization," and Rabbi Israel Goldstein. All three speakers attacked the proposed legislation.

"The Church is commissioned to guide man to eternal happiness," Archbishop Lucey said, "but it necessarily must be concerned with everyday conditions. The Church believes in association of laborers for their own good and the good of society."

"Some Congressmen assume that unions can be weakened and management strengthened without injuring the economy of the nation. This is refuted by the fact that wages will lag further behind prices."

"More government control is desired by some Congressmen, but this country is not that desperate. We have seen the results of government control abroad and it always invites rebellion. Labor and management can agree," he concluded, adding that the Taft-Hartley measures were not the means by which such agreement could be achieved.
