Fr. Boyle Offers Baccalaureate Mass at Fordham

The Baccalaureate Mass inaugurating and consecrating the activities of Commencement Week at Fordham University will be celebrated this year by the Rev. Charles V. Boyle, associate superintendent of schools, Diocese of Rochester.

Returning this year to a Fordham tradition of over 100 years standing, and interrupted only by the war, Father Boyle will celebrate this Solemn Mass in the gymnasium on the Bronx campus Sunday June 8, at 11 a. m.

The invitation to offer the Solemn Mass for the assembled graduates and faculties of the various colleges comprising Fordham University came from the Rev. Charles J. Deane, S. J., the secretary general of the university.

This ancient Catholic custom of offering the holy sacrifice of the Mass for the spiritual and temporal welfare of the students who have successfully completed their courses of study and are about to receive their degrees, has been borrowed from the great universities of Europe, such as Oxford, Cambridge, Paris and Salamanca, of which were founded as Catholic institutions of higher learning.
