

400 Persons At Watkins Glen Field Mass

Watkins Glen — Over 400 people attended the annual field mass at St. Mary's of the Lake Cemetery here on Memorial Day celebrated by the Rev. Walter J. Kohl, pastor of St. Mary's.

Assisting Father Kohl were the Rev. Philip McHugh, chaplain of St. Joseph's Hospital of Elmira, as deacon, and the Rev. Daniel Hogan, assistant of St. Mary's, subdeacon.

Rev. Thomas Tobin, U.S.A., former U. S. Army chaplain, now attached to the Geneva Laymen's Welfare House, preached the sermon, emphasizing the need for recognizing the Christian concept of death.

He quoted St. Paul's words that we should not grieve as the wages; who have no hope; for a Christian the grave is but the gate to a new life. Death is not all, said Father Tobin. It is the end of existence, but the beginning of the rest life of the immortal soul. The speaker emphasized the duty of the living to the young men and women who offered their lives as a sacrifice that others might enjoy true liberty and freedom of religion.
