The bitter atmosphere in which the bill was hammered out by our taymakers on Capnot Hill has engendered new teclings of class conflict between the ranks of management and labor. Blame for this sorry sit untion falls upon all hands con cerned. In its eagerness for a "law to correct labor abuses." Big Business, speaking through the Big Puess, seems more in terested in weakening organ tzed labor than in promoting the welfare of the nation's work. ers. There is reason to suspect. too, that Congress is trying to pass not a "labor taw" but a "Truman law" a law which the President can beither sign nor veto without being politically emborrassed. The failure of the angry labus leaders to come. TO 'OUTRAGE forth with some constructive counter proposals may have been, as some think a blunder in labor statesmanship.

It is significant that the Tatt Hartley bill in its float draft. which supporters say is 'mild." is meeting strong opposition in Catholie elreies.

In the judgment of America. the authoritative Jesuii weekly. "the Taft-Hartley bill is a clever amaigam in which the good, bad and dubious are mixed in about equal portions:"

In the same tasue of America, Father Benjamin Masse, the paper's labor expert, disputes the Republican interpretation that last fall's election gave the pres ent Congress "a mandate of the people" to fashion a drastic ia bor law. "It is certain," he states, "that the public never voted for the Hartley bill, and very dubious that it wanted any thing so still as the Taft bill

One can only wish that the editorial writers of the Big Press would approach the merits of the Taft Hartley bill with the same genuine concern for the nation's workers and industrial peace as does Father Masse He writes The right way to industrial

peace lies partly through cules tive bargaining on a plane of equality and partnership and partly through State programs which will assist workers to sat Ist's needs that connot otherwise be met. By this test, the labor policy of the present Congress' has been gravely delicient. The Taft bill reflects more the class employers than it does a concern with successful collective hargaining. And in no instance has the 80th Congress approved legislation aimed at helping American workers to meet their personal and family obligations The minimum wage remains at 40 cents an hour, the Wagner Ellender-Taft housing bill is moribund; nothing is being done about health insurance or nec essary changes in the Social Security Act The Labor De partment has been starved for appropriations with the result that child labor is on the increase and the National Labor Relations Board has a backlog of more than 5,000 cases.

This dismal story lorces Fa ther Masse to conclude that "on the higher level of principle, the labor policy of the 80th Congress badly misses the goal. It will not foster social justice And neither will it bring us in dustrial peace."

The need for restrictive labor legislation is debatable. Cer tainly the merits of the Taft Hartley bill are highly debata ble And it is also certain that those who think that a new iaw is going to bring industrial peace are only dreamers.

A change of heart rathe, than a change of law is the thing which will bring industrial peace to our country. Only when emplayers and employers join together and work with a genuine sense of social and moral responsibility for the common welfare can we hope for industrial peace and the end of class strife This spirit must enter into the hearts of workers and employ ers as well as into the law
