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

### 'Polar Priest' Writing Book





# The German Underground

The tall, building man sat back in the leather chair. Far below the skaters circled around the rink in Rockefeller Plaza Vuletide shoppers battled the chill wind that swept through Fifth Avenue.

The spires of St. Patrick's Cathedral stood out clearly against the glittering stars of a December winter sky It was just before Christmas, 1943. "I can tell you there IS a Eleman underground," the man aid. "It operates under the most difficult of circumstances. Yet -it may be heard from

The speaker was that out standing radio reporter and foreign correspondent, Dr. Max Jordan. His prediction was true. The German underground was heard from. And Allen Weish Dulies, international lawyer, treaty expert and former foreign service man at last tells the story of the men who fought Hitler from within. In another short work prepared by Gero v.S Gaevernitz, Fabian von Schlabrendorf, the man who almost killed Hitler on several occasions, tells his story.

They Almost Killed Hitler. (Gacvernitz edited Schlahrendorf Macmillan publications) Allen Welsh Dulles has been an interested participant in world affairs for over thirty years. Originally in the diplomatte service and one-time Chief of the Division of Near Eastern Affairs in the State Department, this international lawyer and treaty specialist was attracted to the Office of Strategic Service when it started in 1942. He spent the war years in Switzerland, gathering information, advancing aid when he could-and relaying all the intelligence he could back to Washington.

Actually the story of the anti-Hitler underground goes back to the heetic days of 1933 when Hitler assumed control of the Reich. Some of the graduates of the German Universities saw that their fundamental liberties were in grave danger. Having found that the organized thugs of the Nazi Party were too many to cope with, they decided to form an underground. It must be recalled and kept in mind that they were doing so under the nose of the second most ruthless terror and secret police in his-

For all the thoroughness of the Gestapo, they did not touch such key men in the under-ground as Admiral Cabaria, chief of naval intelligence or a score of generals who saw de-feat long before the investor of Poland. Neither were several prominent civil servants and former diplomata caught up with by Himmler's hordes until the second bomb fallure that merely injured filtler when

If this happens the Communists will probably take over the French government. And thus-France will fall in with Hun-gary, Yugoslavia, Bulgaria, Rumania, Poland, and many others who are no more than Soviet satellites. Continuation of the strike may serve the French workers, but it will serve Soviet Russia more.


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
