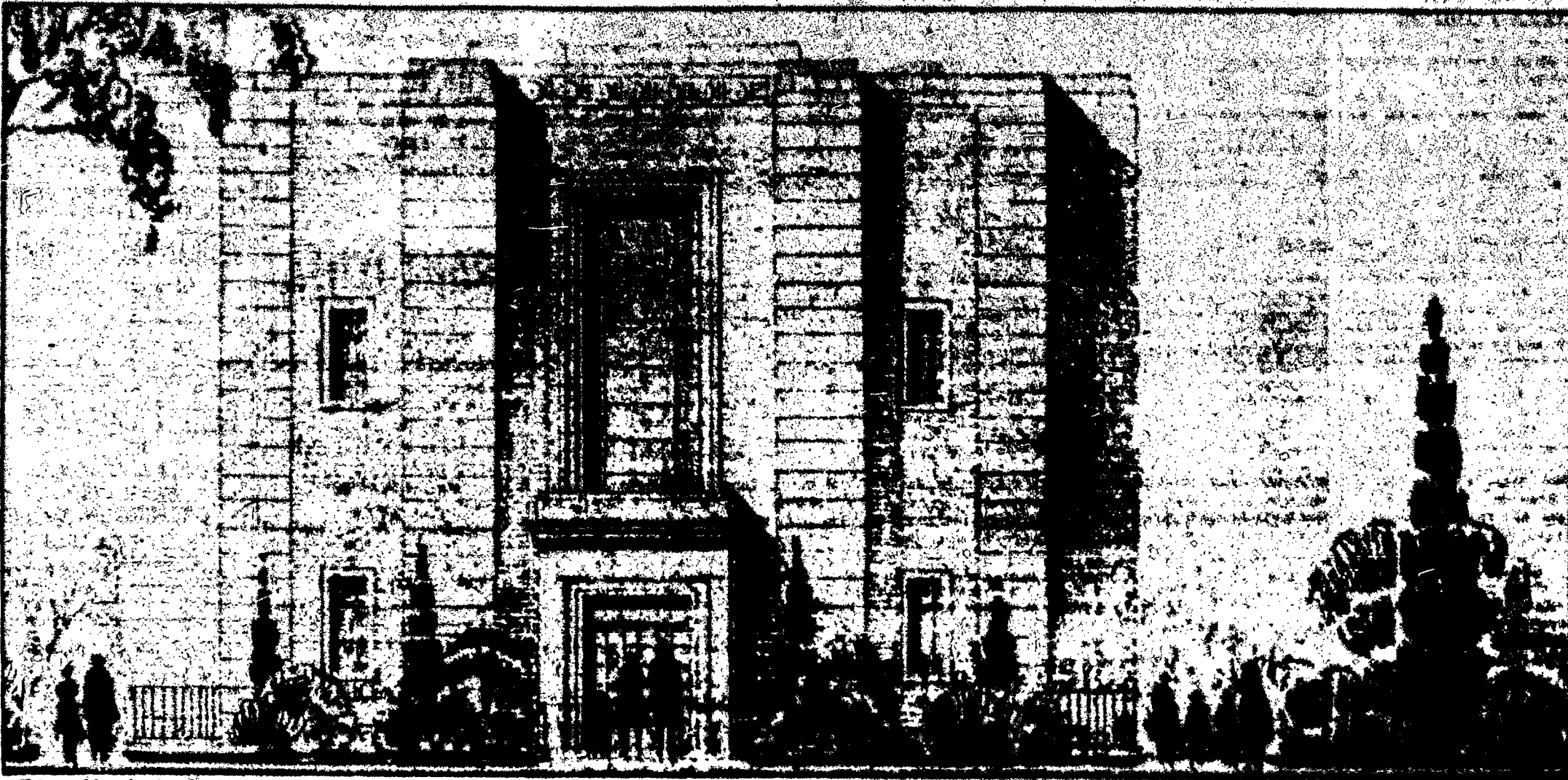


# NEW SCHOOL PLANNED TO REPLACE ONE LOST IN ELMIRA FIRE

## New St. Anthony's School to Launch \$400,000 Program

Inaugurating a \$400,000 building program for St. Anthony's Church and School, the Rev. Albert L. Simonetti, pastor, announced today that plans for the first building are announced. The new school will be a three-story structure, 40 by 60 feet, with a central tower. It will be the beginning of a \$400,000 building program, according to the Rev. Albert L. Simonetti, pastor.

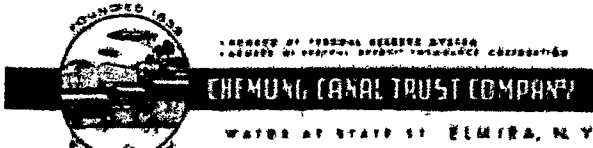
