Over two hundred Ladies of Charity attended the General Assembly and Tea which was held at Our Lady of Lourdes' Church, Elmira, on Sunday also commemorated the seventh anniversary of the organization of the Ladies of Charity.

The program was preceded by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament celebrated by the Rev. Leo G. Schwab, Moderator of Ladies of Charity.

Mrs. John McCormack, President, introduced the guest speaker, Mrs. Mary Lennon Snyder of Auburn. Mrs. Snyder is a Charter Member of the Elmira organization and was its first president.

In her talk, Mrs. Snyder reviewed the work of the Ladies of Charity in past accomplishments and spoke of the many projects of the organization which are not seasonal and from which there is no vacation.

Speaking of the Holy Father, Mrs. Snyder called for Catholic Action, urging
