Columnist David Lawrence, whose syndicated apinions are carried by the Gannett Press and other American newspapers, has been around a long time but seldom has ne written so recklessly as he did in the final hours of the Taft-Hartley labor bill battle

Few journalists campaigned more vigurously for passage of the labor bill, which is now law than did columnist Lawrence He was very angry, therefore, when the Social Action Depart ment of the National Carbolic Welfare Conference issued a statement viging the President to veto the Taft Hartley meas

Mr. Lawrence has a right to his own opinion. He has a right to disagree with anyhody. even the Social Action Depart ment. But columnist Lawrence. who earns his living by publicly expressing his opinion on public think that the Social Action NCWC group should enjoy the same right of public expression. in a column freighted more with abuse than objective thinking. Mr. Lawrence took the position that the NCWC group had no business teiling the President what it thought about the labor

In accents distinctly facility Mr Lawrence gives out this lordly dictum

"It is not the function of a church unit at national near quarters, using the name "atholic' to enter into a detailed discussion of the merits of highly technical provisions and to urge in effect, on the President that Catholic voters share or might share these views and that hence Mr Truman might better heed the advice"

Surely the right of defining the functions of any Catholic group is a responsibility which belongs to the hishops and not to any professional opinionmolder like Mr Laurence Does he know that Busnop Alter, episcopal chairman of the Social Action Department, approved of the group a labor bill statement in advance of its re-

Social Action Department are framed and experienced social experts. They are every bit as able as Mr Lawrence who should be ready to admit that Catholic voters possibly might be as interested in the upinions of Catholic social action experts as in the opinion of paid spokes men of Big Business or the Big Press. Incidentally, it is un canny how columnists like Mr Lawrence can be so consistently in agreement with the anti-labor policies of those newspapers which pay for their columns.
