Vaticas City - (NC) - His Holiness Pope Pius XII has preclaimed three new saints of the church: Joso de Britto, a Portsquese martyr, who died in India in 1693; Father Gluseppe Cafassio a ho died in Turta in 1980; and Remardino Realino, Italian Jasall who died in 1616.

Tens of thousands, including several thousand pligrims from Portugal and the Portuguese posassions in Africa and India wit nessed the endorful ceremonices in St. Peter's Basilica.

Among the pligrims were hunireds of natives from the Portsguese possessions in Africa and Asia who had come to Rome to gether with Pedro IV, King of the Congo, who occupied a special seat in the tribune of the apse of St. Peter's. As a gift for the Holy Father, King Pedro had brought with him two elephant tuaks, which he will present in a special audience.


