> Eabor experts, unconnected with trade untonism, fought the enactment of this legislation. There is hardly a man who has done any work in the field of mediation, arbitration. and contract negotiation, or anyone who has devoted his life to studying labor problems who approved this bill Men'like William Davis, Sumner Schlieter Ludwig Teller, gave Congress specific objections to the bill They warned as Truman warned, that the Taft-Hartley Bill would not bring labor peace. It would merely stir up more trouble. And these men have had more experience with trade unionism than Mr Tail or Mr Hartley will ever have

> The Churches opposed the Taft Hartle, Bill. The National Catholic Weifare Conference. speaking for the American Heirarchy, issued a statement condemning the legislation. And a delegation of Catholic priesta Protestant ministera and Jewish tabbis, visited President Truman last week to inform him that the 1,000 clergymen whom they represented were requesting a presidential veto of the bill. No priest with any knowledge of labor relations has appeared to approve the bill And there are hundreds of such priests.

> Many industrialists opposed the bill. Even Wall Street breathed a sigh of relief when the bill was vetoed. These men know that regulation of collective bargaining by the government means more government control of business. They did not dare go on record in opposition to the National Associa tion of Manufacturers and the Chamber of Commerce. But they secretly hoped that the

bill would soon be forgotten. Employer associations and farm organizations favored the bill. But these groups were not merely interested in curb ing trade unions. They would like to see labor organizations permanently crippled. The Taft Bill was called a mild bill. Yet these groups openly declared that they favored the victous Hartley Bill.

The Communists were hoping that the Taft-Hartley Bill would become law. They, too, were silent in their approval. 
