Delegate Status Given for Holy Name Session

Four important points relative to the 4th National Holy Name Convention to be held in Boston this October are stressed by the National Headquarters in a release this week to Catholic newspapers of the country.

Eligibility of Holy Name members attending is cited for the benefit of each parish society, according to Lewis A. Schur, president of Rochester Diocesan Holy Name Union.

The points of information as released by the Very Rev. Harry C. Graham, O.P., national director of the society are these:

1. Every parish is allowed as many delegates as it wishes.
2. Every parish should have at least one official delegate representing the local unit at the convention, but all Holy Name members are invited and, in fact, strongly urged to attend.

3. Complete hotel and housing accommodations have been arranged to take care of those coming from out of town during the span of the convention which will run from October 1 to 5.

4. Air, bus and railroad companies have been notified of the meeting and have extended assurances of their cooperation. In the case of rail transportation, one and one-half fare will be charged for the complete two way round trip from any part of the country, and special coaches will be provided for Holy Name groups.

Holy Family Held Graduates Model

Auburn — No matter where life and death may come, there always is some good to be had with it, that because of our present condition, we will be able to "make it" better.

Bishop James E. Keane, of Rochester, presided at the 14th annual commencement of Holy Family High School at the 14th annual commencement June 24.

A class of 87 students were awarded diplomas at the ceremonies in Holy Family Auditorium.

Emphasizing the value of 21 years of education and 4 years of high school training under the patronage of the Holy Family, Bishop Keane told the class of boys and girls that they could never have attained the meaning of their school in these days "if we were to have the same Holy and Jesus as we have today."

Recalling that St. Joseph, in the person of a happy death, the Bishop pronounced his last thoughts in the heart of the Holy Family.

"Any school will prepare you specially for life," he declared. "Holy Family has not stopped about preparing you for death because in your particular case the success of this school will be finally checked up until the day of judgment."

He described the Blessed Lady in her role of mother following the graduates through life.

Petering Christ, the third member of the Holy Family, as "one figure that will have you all through your days, the Bishop referred to him as the 'Model of Heaven'." He said that the Holy Family is a model for the people by Francis Thompson.

Whether you are a Holy Family member or not, the Bishop said that wherever they are, you, your life, your habits, your thoughts, your pronunciation, your presence in society, will always be working of the Holy Family.

Opening address of the program on Archbishop Maguire was given by Paul McManus, pastor of the Holy Family Church, St. Paul's, N.Y. He had a few words to say at the program.

Miss Lorraine Brennan, with a four year average of 84.5 percent, delivered the valedictory, "Our Lady, Queen of the Society."

Dean Edwin Williams, Very Rev. Dean John A. Conway, pastor of Holy Family Church, welcomed Bishop Keane and briefly congratulated the graduates wishing their success in life.

Rev. William E. Davis, principal, presented the class and spoke a brief word of appreciation to the members of the faculty and to the students for their cooperation and for the outstanding scholastic record established by the class.
