**Court Bus
Dissent Held
Unlawful**

Detroit — (NC) — A charge that the arguments on which Supreme Court Justice Wiley Rutledge based his dissent in the New Jersey bus fare case last February were themselves a violation of the first amendment of the U. S. Constitution was made by the Rev. Wilfrid Parsons, S.J., of the Catholic University of America, here.

In dissenting from the majority opinion, which held that there was nothing unconstitutional about the New Jersey State law providing payment for transportation of parochial as well as public school children, Justice Rutledge had declared that public paid transportation for parochial school children was a violation of the first amendment.
