State Dept. Fires 10 'Disloyalists'

Washington - (NC) - The State Department has revealed that it has recently discharged "at least ten" employes sus-pected of disloyalty to the United States. The workers. whose salaries ranged from \$3. 200 to \$3,000 a year, were virtually all in sections which the State Department absorbed from wartime governmental sgencies whose work has ended. The dismissals were made under a provision of the State Department 1947 appropriation act, which gives the Secretary of State "absolute discretion" to discharge any employe whenever he shall deem such termination necessary or advisable in the interest of the

United States." A Federal District Court judge also sentenced Carl Marsani, former minor official of the State Department, to one to three years imprisonment on a charge of concealing Com-munist party affiliations in a Federal loyalty test.
