

Governor Watten of Californie is no longer the friend of labor. At least so we're told by the California Pederation of Labor. The Governor was rash enough to sign a bill outlawing jurisdictional strikes such as the one which cost at much money and bloodshed in Holly. wood some months ago. Per hape the new law is no per manent solution to the problem of frieldictional disputes, but it is certain that labor would not have approved any legisla-tion dealing with this ticklish

A LOOK AT

It is difficult to understand on what basis some labor leaders determine who are their friends. A few would lead us to believe that you have to approve everything they do and advocate everything in their program before you are a friend of labor. It may be conceded that labor unions are no different from employer assoclations, educational groups, and religious institutions in reelsting any legislation that curtails their power. Yet labor leaders should realize by now that there is little justification for the harm caused by jurisditional disputes exist because carpenters who handle woodwork will sooner or later clash with metal workers when window frames are made of metal. Such disputes must be settled by arbitration without resort to strike. A jurisdictional strike catches the employer and the public in the middle. Regardless of which union is given the work, the other union men will go on strike anyway. A case in point is the dispute between the A. F. L. electrical workers and the telephone unions over who shall install the lines at the Idlewild Airport These strikes give labor a bad name and if the unions themselves will not settle the matter, they cannot expect the government to sit idly by and lot them injure the community. Probably, there are some cir-

cumstances in which a jurisdictional strike so called might be justified. Where the employer is responsible for the dispule by favoring one union over another without regard for the wishes of the workers, e. g. the case of the Kaiser shippards during the war; or when union work is handed to non-union laborers; or when it is a choice between a bona fide labor union and a company union, there might be some justification. But outside of these circumstances, most jurisdictional strikes are unjusti-

The problem would be simpler if labor unions would arbitrate jurisdictional differences. But union leaders generally hale arbitrators. When arbitration of some jurisdictional dispute is proposed the typical response is "Do you want some outsider to take our jobs away from us?" They forget that if. they are really entitled to the jobs, the arbitrator will give them the award. Whereas, if they have no title to the jobs, they must be prepared to forego any claims to them. Even when an arbitrator favors the side of a particular union, he still gets no sympathy from the union Union leaders avoid arblirators as if they were covered with a loathsome disease. Even when the union is wrong. the men believe that the arbitraior committed an injustice. The attitude is a peculiar one and is born of the fear of unemployment.

An important defect in the Tafi-Hartley Bill makes the National Labor Relations Board the arbitrator of jurisdictional disputes. The Senate version of the law would have given the Board power to appoint arbitrators. But the House conferees insisted that the Board do the job This is a ticklish decision. Unions have to deal with the Board day in and day out. They have to have confidence in the Board. If they develop the same attitude to the Board that they have toward arbitrators, the effectiveness of the Board is going to be handicapped. The Board, as an instrument of industrial peace, cannot afford to encourage the lil-will of labor, even when labor is in the wrong.

La b or leaders, however, should grow up to their responsibility and recognize jurisdictional disputes as evils, to be curbed by labor, or by the government


