Parts - (NC) The Very Rev William Slattery, C M., of Balti more, elected Superior General of the 4,500 Vincentian Fathers stationed throughout the world at the general assembly of the community held here, became the first American to hold this office By his election Father Stattery also became Superior General of the Daughters of Charity of Si Vincent de Paul, a world-wide community of 42,000 nuns. The Baltimore priest, succeeds the late Very Rev. Charles L. Squva) C.M., who died in Paris in Decem ber, 1939. Father Stattery has been stationed here since June 1946, as assistant to the Vincentian vicar general.

Father Slattery, the 19th suc cessor to St. Vincent de Paul. was born in the Vincentian parish of the Immaculate Conception of Baltimore on May 7, 1895. and received his primary schooling from the Daughters of Char ity, who taught in the parish school. He attended St. Vincent's Seminary in Germantown, Pa and was ordained in 1919.

Washington, (NC) An as surance that the United States is employing "all possible diligence" in preventing the involuntary repatriation of Croatian and other Yougoslav displaced perto their Titolerrorized homeland has been given to Representative John W. McCormack of Massachusetis, by Under See retary of State Dean Acheson.

The assurance came in response to a protest which McCow mack made with the State De-partment over a report that a group of Groatian DPs had been sent back to their homeland against their will by British authorities from a displaced per-

sons camp in Italy.
