GUATENALA This country offers no great opportunity as yet for the cells of Moscow to increase and mulliply. There are two parties from which Communism might spring: either the Workers

Social Democratic Party" or "The Social Reform Party." Due to the similarity of the name with the Communist Party in other countries, experieneed observers feel that the former might be the Red cell.

From Moscow through Mexico City to Guatemaia comes'a stream of propagatida. This is disseminated throughout eCetral America. It is earning Guatemala City a reputation equaling that of Mexico City in its Red beyday, although it has yet to match the bustle and activity of Havana. President Just Jose Arvalo has described

the Soviet sympathizers as a "routine fraction" of the poputation. Guatemala is apparent ly looked upon as a rock from which to distribute material rather than as a seed-bed for immediate culture.

NICARAGUA

The most prominent of the "banana republics" Nicaragua has not been neglected by the Soviets. While Marxian activities have fallen off somewhat since the death of Moscow's ambassador to Mexico. Constanline Qumansky, this should not be interpreted too favorably. A few months ago a minor Soviet employee in a neighboring country was discovered sending material into Nicaragua. 


