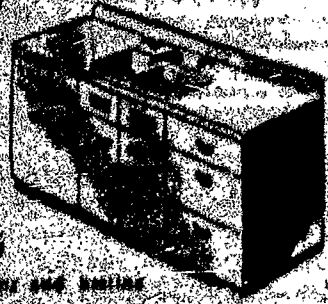

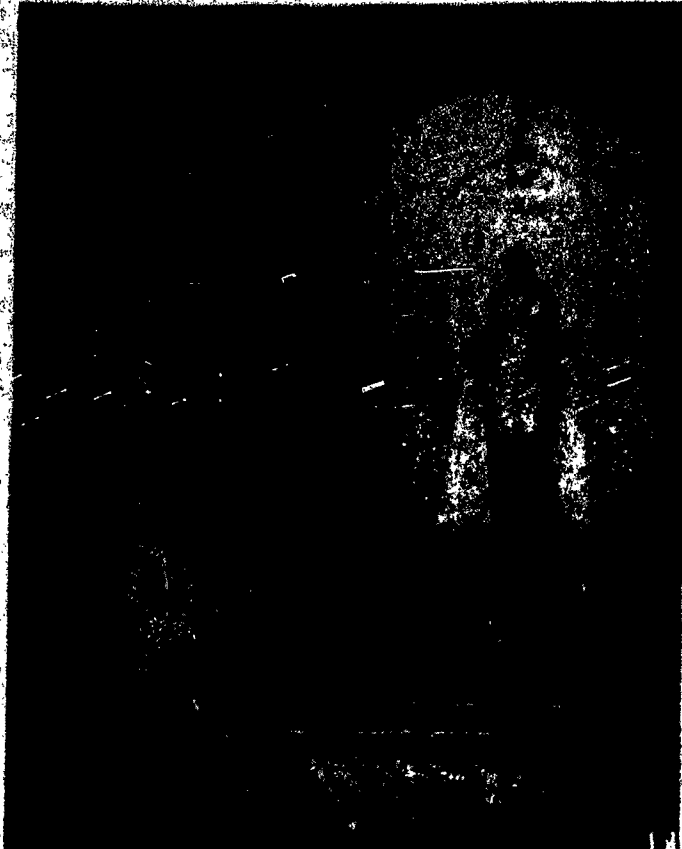

Miraculous Medal Nun
Canonized at Vatican

Rome (NC)—The glorious
pageantry which marked the
canonization of St. Catherine La-
bouré by His Holiness Pope
Plus XII in St. Peter's Basilica
here Sunday was a profound con-
trast to the lowliness of the Sis-
ter of Charity to whom Our Lady
revealed the Miraculous Medal.

While millions of Catholics
throughout the world wore the
medal during the nun's lifetime,
the Christian world, including the
reigning Pontiff, Pope Gregory
XIII, who had personally held the
Miraculous Medal in high regard,
did not know the author of the
medal. Only the nun's confessor,
Father Aladié, knew the secret
and from him she had exacted a
promise that he never tell any-
one her name.

Also remarkable about St.
Catherine, who Sunday became
the eighth saint canonized by the
Holy Father during the first seven
months of this year, is the fact
that the introduction of her cause
was not suggested by her com-
munity but by the late Cardinal
Mastella, then Prefect of the
Sacred Congregation of Rites,
the very congregation whose duty
it is to check carefully the virtues
of the servants of God proposed
for the honors of the altar.

Cardinal Urges Beatification
It all came about when the
Holy See was petitioned for a
feast day in honor of Our Lady
of the Miraculous Medal. Ac-
companying the petition, forward-
ed to Cardinal Mastella were
documents recounting the ap-
pearances. The story so impressed
the Cardinal that he urged the
superiors of the Sisters of Char-
ity to begin the process for
Catherine's beatification.

When the Sisters hesitated,
pointing out that it was the spirit
of their rule to shrink from
glory, the Cardinal declared: "If
you do not undertake this cause,
I will do so myself." The cause
was begun in 1895.
Sister Catherine Labouré was
beatified in 1933 and the two
further miracles necessary for
her canonization came shortly
afterwards. The first, occurring
the same year as the nun's
beatification, concerns one Jo-
sephine Goudard, who was suffer-
ing from a serious heart ailment
and had received the Last Sacra-
ments. After imploring the in-
tercession of Blessed Catherine
she was perfectly cured—a cure
confirmed by two doctors who
attended her and by four experts
sent by the Congregation of
Rites.

The second miracle wrought
through St. Catherine's interces-
sion occurred in 1937. It con-
cerns a Sister Irene Pascal of
the Daughters of Charity, who
had undergone four operations
for adhesions. Doctors had
labeled her condition incurable
but on the Saturday of a novena
to St. Catherine, Sister Irene was
completely cured.

Succeeds Abp. Ray
Quebec (NC)—The Most Rev.
Georges Leon Pelletier, former
Auxiliary Bishop of Quebec and
Vicar Capitular at Quebec fol-
lowing the death of Cardinal Vil-
lebrune, has been named Bishop
of Three Rivers. He succeeds the
Most Rev. Maurice Roy, who was
installed this week as Archbishop
of Quebec.

tion of Church and State. It is
parading once more or more pre-
cisely, it is being paraded. It
is supposed to frighten and in-
timidate. But of late it has been
used to smear, a well known
tactic.
"What is so puzzling to so
many," he said, "is why such an
action should be brought against
the state and why one single col-
lege in the city of Buffalo should
be enjoined from following the
requests of Gov. Dewey to serve
the veterans.
"Other colleges and universities
have been free to expand their
facilities for the veterans. Among
the best comments on this puzzle
is that of a group of veterans
who asked: Is this the kind of
democracy and tolerance we
served and fought for?"
Father Schouen continued. The
veterans served their country.
Deont men believe that those
who returned have a right to
expect educational aid. The fed-
eral and state governments have
provided a constitutional basis
for that aid. The educational in-
stitutions were requested to co-
operate. The method of admin-
istration set up by the Govern-
ment's model one, Canisius Col-
lege, has contained in that
method.
"Once and for all it should be
noted that this sort of thing is
not admirable. To state of sep-
aration of church and state has
its silly side. In this instance
where it is being used to do harm
and breed tensions it is seriously
wrong. It is a state case of in-
justice," he stated.

Tri-State Congress
Lists Card. Mooney

Grand Rapids, Mich. (NC)—
His Eminence Edward Cardinal
Mooney, Archbishop of Detroit,
will preside at the mass meeting
on the opening day of the Cath-
olic Tri-State Congress to be
held here from Sept. 12 to 17.
Archbishop Robert E. Lucey of
San Antonio will deliver the key-
note address at the meeting and
Clement Lane, city editor of the
Chicago Daily News, will speak
on 'The Family and Basic Train-
ing.' Mayor Welch of Grand
Rapids will extend an official
welcome to the estimated three
or four thousand delegates from
dioceses in Michigan, Indiana and
Ohio.

Maronites Pledge
Allegiance to Pope

Rome (RNS) Pope Plus XII
has received assurances from
Maronite Patriarch Anthony
Peter Arida that it is "the irre-
vocable decision of every Maron-
ite to live and die in communion
with the Roman Pontiff."
The Patriarch's message was
conveyed to the Pope by the Most
Rev. Antonio Abed, Maronite
Archbishop of Tripoli. Arch-
bishop Abed said that Patriarch
Arida was unable to come to
Rome because of the infirmities
of age. The Patriarch is 88 years
old.
