Some of the London newspapera evidently more interexted in mischiel than in movies, have tried to interpret this move as an anti-american one designed to eater to what they deciare is a public revulsion against Hollywood in per-ticular and the U.S.A. in genexal.

Although numbers of lintrun London theaters are now showing only British kilous. charge still are lines forming as other theaters to see American ones. The firlish people have money to spend on almost anything they can get without coupons. There is very little they can get. Movies are not rationed and provided they are interesting enough they can help to forget, at least for a short while, that the going is tough.

Fictures in which Hollywood presents a too easy life, with stores and tables laden heavily with luxuries, arouse ribaldry arriong British audiences. This fades into envy and resentment. Hollywood should bewere of mistaking its own peculiar ways for the true American way unless it would make films that are certain to drive patronago away from American to British and other foreign films. Politicians who take the short view argue against althwing any more American films into Britain They say Britain must buy food before films.

The British film people who take a longer view, while pleased to be able to compete artistically and even commercially with Hollywood, believe that if their new movies are given a fair break in the theaters of the U.S.A., they will carn for Britain more dellars with which to bus food from America.

Certainly the British theaters could not get along at the present time, without any Hellywood films at all. Not, that is, unless they re-show some of the old British films made many years ago.

This Hollywood already is doing quite profitably in British theaters. The fact is that the British

people do not care where the films come from as long as they are good. They have no quarrel with America or with American industries. They are tired and rather! hard pressed, but they are not, as some sections of the British preas suggest, bitter or dis-piritell.


