Warnew - e(RNS) - Fath. er Leon Pawlina was sentenced to ten sears imprisonment by a military court here on charges of explomage. For mer director of the Warsaw branch of Caritae, he is the first Catholic priest in Paland to be

sentenced on such a charge. Accused of baving gathered secret military information for a local newspaper, Father Pawline was spared the death penalty, the judges reportedly having taken into consideration his cierical status and the fact that he had pleaded guilty. Church leaders meanwhile are said to be "gravely disturbed" over the outcome of the trial.

One of Father Pawling's two co-defendants, Sygmund Matejec, secret police official, was sentenered to death. The third deferidant, Sygmund Augustynski, editor of the Gazeta Ludowa, to whom Father Pawlina was said to have supplied the information he gathered, was sent to prison for fifteen years.
