## Vatican Flays Berlin Leftists

New York (NC) — The Vatican Radio has scored the "represensible measures" used by socialist and communist groups in Berlin in bringing young people to the Life Guidance classes and dedication ceremonies at the end of the school year, where it charges they are tainted with anti-religious propaganda. The Vatican broadcast was picked up by the U. S. Government monitor service here.

"Young people who are willing to take part in the dedication ceremonies receive preference in getting vouchers for important goods," the Vatican radio charged, as quoted by the U. S. monitors. "Life Guidance classes and the dedication ceremony take the place of religious instruction, First Communion, and Confirmation. Working-class parents are thus systematically encouraged to estrange their children from the Christian religion and Church in the hope of getting new clothing vouchers."

Bishop James E. Keane will have an active part in the ceremonies and public events of the Centennial Eucharistic Congress to be held in Buffalo Sept. 23 to 25.

Bishop John J. O'Hara, bishop of Buffalo, has invited Bishop Keane to be the celebrant at the Solemn Holy Hour for canon which will take place at 9 p. m. on Wednesday, September 24 in the Buffalo Civic Stadium. Bishop Keane will also be the principal speaker at a meeting of the Missionary Union of the Clergy in the Hotel Statler Ballroom Tuesday afternoon, September 23, and will preside at a sectional meeting of college students in the Hotel Lafayette on Wednesday afternoon, September 24.

The Diocese of Buffalo is making elaborate plans for the Eucharistic Congress which will commemorate the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Diocese. Five Cardinals, scores of bishops and priests and hundreds of thousands of Catholics from at least 35 states and Canada are expected to attend some of the events of the Congress. There will be outdoor Pontifical Masses in the Civic Stadium on all three days of the celebration. An Oriental Pontifical Mass in St. Joseph's Cathedral on Sept. 24 will interest many who have never participated in the liturgy of the Eastern Churches. Holy Hours for children, priests, sisters, men and women are scheduled for different periods during the Congress. There will be sectional meetings in the Hotel Statler and Lafayette for various professional groups and lay organizations.

The closing ceremony of the Congress will be a solemn Eucharistic procession through downtown Buffalo on Thursday, September 25.

Reservations in hotels or private dwellings may be secured by addressing the Congress Headquarters, Hotel Statler, Buffalo.

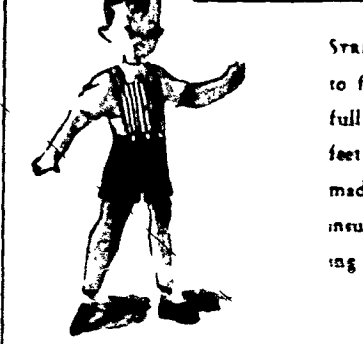
## Heads County Vets Reunion Delegation
