

Bishop to Have Active Role In Buffalo Rites

Bishop James E. Kearney will have an active part in the ceremonies and public events of the Centennial Eucharistic Congress to be held in Buffalo Sept. 22 to 23.

Bishop John F. O'Hara, Bishop of Buffalo, has invited Bishop Kearney to be the celebrant at the Solemn Holy Hour for men which will take place at 9:30 p. m. on Wednesday, September 24 in the Buffalo Civic Stadium.

Bishop Kearney will also be the principal speaker at a meeting of the Missionary Union of the Clergy in the Hotel Statler Ball room, Tuesday afternoon, September 23 and will preside at a sectional meeting of college students in the Hotel Lafayette on Wednesday afternoon September 24.

Five Cardinals Due

The Diocese of Buffalo is making elaborate plans for the Eucharistic Congress which will commemorate the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Diocese.

Five Cardinals, scores of bishops and priests and hundreds of thousands of Catholics from at least 5 states and Canada are expected to attend some of the events of the Congress. There will be outdoor Pontifical Masses in the Civic Stadium on all three days of the celebration. An Oriental Pontifical Mass in St. Joseph's Cathedral on Sept. 24 will interest many who have never participated in the liturgy of the Eastern Churches. Holy Hours for children, priests, sisters, men and women are scheduled for different periods during the Congress. There will be sectional meetings in the Hotel Statler and Lafayette for various professional groups and lay organizations.

The closing ceremony of the Congress will be a solemn Eucharistic procession through the aware Park on Thursday, September 25.

Reservations in hotels or private dwellings may be secured by addressing the Congress Headquarters, Hotel Statler, Buffalo.

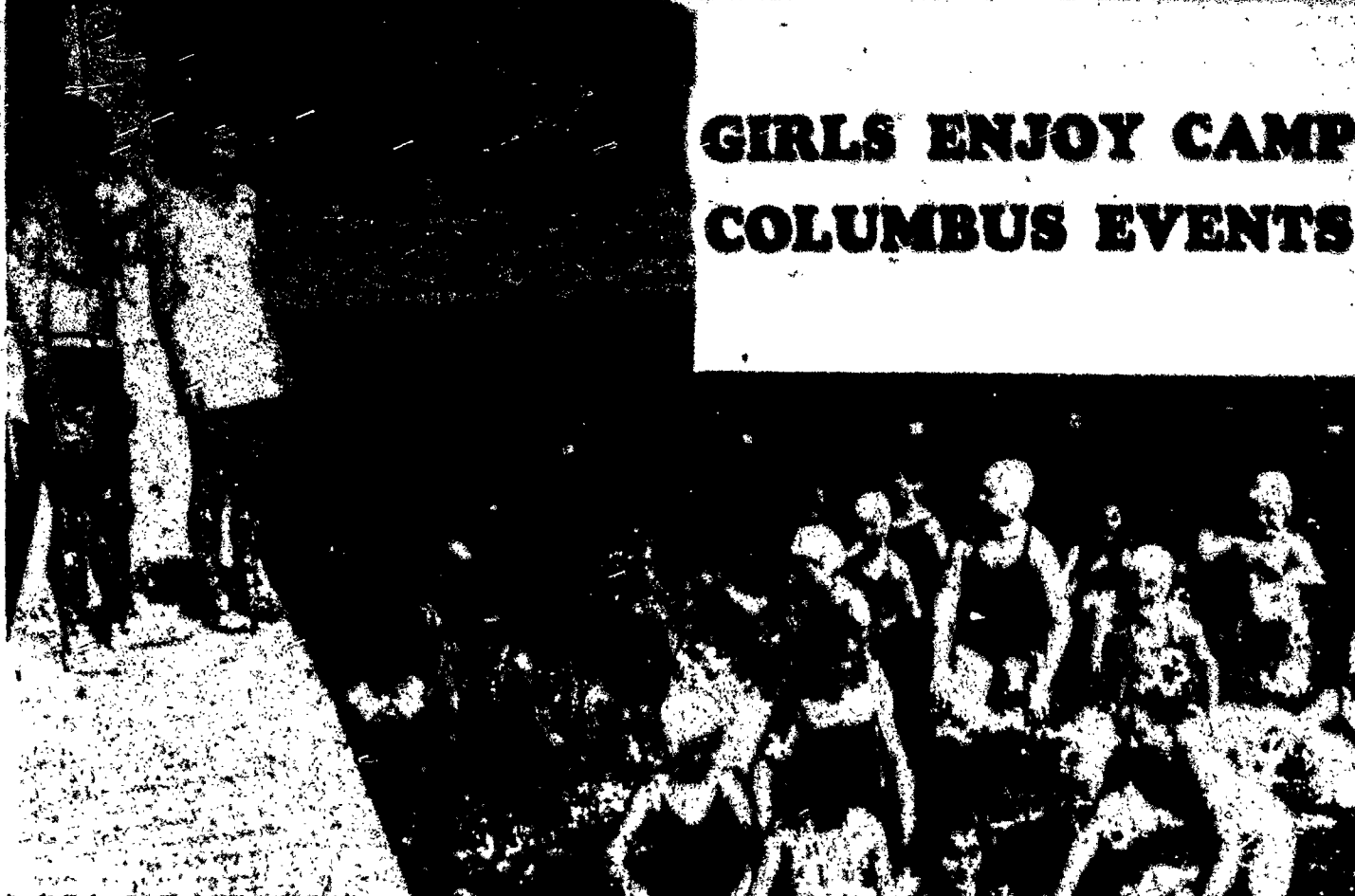

On 10,000 Mile Mission Trip CWV Team Wins City B League Title

Montreal — (RNR) A mission vessel of the Oblate Fathers in Hudson Bay, the "Regina Polaris" left here on its maiden voyage which will take it and its crew of 12 on a round trip of 10,000 miles, bringing supplies to missionaries in the Far North.

The ship, first to sail on this mission since the M.F. Therese was shipwrecked three years ago, will proceed down the St. Lawrence River into the Gulf, north along the Labrador coast and west through Hudson's Straits and into the large inland sea of Hudson Bay.

The Vicariate of Hudson Bay is a mission territory reaching to the North Pole and covering a million square miles of trackless, railroadless land. Widely scattered over the huge wastes live some 5,000 Eskimos among whom 30 Oblate missionaries have been working for 25 years to win over to Christianity.

Included in the ship's cargo is lumber, to build missions, coal, food, letters, and parcels from the homes of missionaries, clothing, tools, rifles, spare parts for engines and radios, canoes, etc.

Auburn — The second annual Memorial Military Field Mass will be held at 11 o'clock Sunday morning, Aug. 17, on St. Francis of Assisi Church grounds in lower Clark St. This Mass will honor the men who gave their lives in World Wars I and II, and also those who have returned from military service.

This Mass is being sponsored by both the Holy Name Society of St. Francis Church and the Frank Callmer Post, 8, Indian American World War Veterans, 77, Newcomb Celebrant.

Celebrant of the Mass will be Rev. Bernard C. Newcomb, assistant pastor and chaplain of the Frank Callmer Post. He will be assisted by Rev. Adolph Gabosai, pastor; and Rev. Bernard Hickey, assistant pastor.
