Tito Told Church Will Not Yield

Valonia City (NC)—Archbishop Alojzije Stepinac of Zagreb was kept at his post because he remained with his people throughout the war years, condemned every injustice, regardless of who committed it, and protected those who were persecuted regardless of creed or political belief, writes the *Quotidiano*, daily newspaper of Italy's Catholic Action, in comment on statements attributed to Sava N. Kosanovic, Yugoslav Ambassador to the United States.

The Holy See is not accustomed to accept the impositions of dictators, since shepherds of souls must remain with their flocks, even at the cost of their lives, the newspaper adds.

In further comment on a statement by Marshal Tito of Yugoslavia to seven American Protestant ministers presently visiting that country, the *Quotidiano* declares that Tito desires to bring about a break with Rome for the greater glory of the "Orthodox East" which is due to the commandments of Caesar, even of six Orthodox caesar.

Compassion Europe (New York)—To create that break in the purpose of the press campaign which systematically holds the clergy up to scorn, outrages the Holy See and the Pope and accuses them of the worst crimes against Yugoslavia, the newspaper asserts.

The *Quotidiano* points out that there is liberty to pray in Yugoslavia—because no one, be it Hitler or Tito, can ever control prayer—but there is no liberty of religion. The faithful are permitted to pray, but they are not permitted to live according to their Faith; thus they are being deprived of one of those democratic liberties for which the second world war was avowedly fought, the article adds.

(Ambassador Kosanovic, in releasing the booklet "The Case of Archbishop Stepinac," had referred to an alleged request made by Tito to Bishop Hurley, Regent ad interim of the Apostolic Nunciature in Belgrade, to have Archbishop Stepinac transferred from Yugoslavia, for otherwise we shall be forced to place him under arrest." Tito was said to have given to Bishop Hurley "a file of documentary evidence of the Archbishop's crimes.")

Rural Areas Target

(According to secular press dispatches, Tito told the visiting ministers that he does not foresee improvement in Yugoslavia's relations with the Holy See, and that if the Vatican continues its present stand, relations will deteriorate. He is also quoted as saying that "for the present" there were no signs of a break in relations, "because we have patience.")

(Another press dispatch quotes the visiting ministers as saying they were convinced there is "no interference in freedom of worship" in Yugoslavia.)

It is true, declares the *Quotidiano*, that churches are open in Belgrade, Zagreb and Ljubljana (the principal cities of Yugoslavia) but in the country districts the situation is quite different.

It is definitely known, the paper continues, that along the Dalmatian coast and in Herzegovina there are large areas from which entire populations of localities have been deported.

Mission Bishop, 88, Honored by Pope

Hangchow — Rounding out 61 years in China, Bishop Paul A. Favreau, C.M., retired Vicar Apostolic of Hangchow, has been named assistant of the Pontifical Throne in recognition of his decades of mission service.

Now the oldest bishop in China, both in lifetime and seniority of consecration, Bishop Favreau was born in France in 1886, came to China as a Vincentian seminarian in 1886, was ordained in Ningpo a year later. Consecrated bishop in 1910, he resigned in 1937 but chose to remain in China, residing in the seminary in Kashing in this archdiocese.
