## Hungary Honors NC Relief Aide

New York — (NC) — The Medal of Honor, one of the Hungarian Government's highest honors, has been conferred on Thomas J. Fox, representative in Hungary of War Relief Services-National Catholic Welfare Conference. It was announced here by Miss Edward E. Swanson, executive director of the agency. The award, presented by the Prime Minister of Hungary, was bestowed on Mr. Fox in recognition of his work in connection with War Relief Services-N. C. W. C. in that country.

In connection with this announcement it was made known that a large consignment of food shipped by War Relief Services-N. C. W. C. has just arrived at Budapest. This is the second shipment received at that city within the past two weeks. To date War Relief Services-N. C. W. C. has shipped to Hungary 4,595,774 pounds of food, medicine and clothing valued at \$1,650,310.

Franciscan Provincial Denver — (NC) — Mother M. Rogalska, superior of St. Anthony's Orphanage at Albuquerque, N. Mex., has been elected provincial of the Poor Sisters of St. Francis Seraph of Perpetual Adoration. She has served as assistant provincial since August, 1946, and succeeds Mother Basilla, who has been provincial since on March 19, 1933. The election was held in the community's motherhouse here.

## Redress Promised Indian Christians

Trivandrum, India — (NC) — An assurance that the Travancore Government, acting in an independent native State of India, will pursue a democratic policy as far as possible, was given at a press conference here by Sir C. P. Ramaswami Aiyer, Dewan of Travancore.

Recently the Dewan was criticized by a Christian group, which adopted a resolution asking him to resign on the ground that he acted on a policy hostile to Christian schools and other institutions.

At the press conference, the Dewan praised the Christian community in the State. He pointed out that Christians number one-third of the State's population and added that despite recently adopted rules, which restrict the erection of new Christian churches and the opening of new cemeteries, the Government is prepared to follow a more lenient policy, assuring "redress for the grievances" of Christians.

REFUGEE PRIESTS  
Pulaski, Wis. — (NC) — Six Polish Franciscan priests, bidding their time until conditions change to that they can safely return to their homeland, are now attached to the Assumption province of the Franciscans, with headquarters here. The six at present are teaching in seminaries of the province or preaching missions in Polish parishes in the midwestern and eastern States.

## Abp. Stepinac Case Study Pledged

London — (NC) — His Eminence Bernard Cardinal Griffin, Archbishop of Westminster, has announced that he had been assured that "very careful consideration" would be given to a resolution sent to Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin from a recent big London rally protesting against religious persecution in Yugoslavia and the imprisonment of Archbishop Stepinac of Zagreb.

The resolution urged Mr. Bevin to take all possible action to bring Yugoslav terrorism to an end and to submit the matter as soon as possible to the General Assembly of the United Nations. The assembly meets in September.

St. Adalbert Anniversary — Observances commemorating the 550th anniversary of the death of St. Adalbert, patron saint and evangelizer of Czechs, Slovaks, and Poles, have been inaugurated here by Archbishop Joseph Beran of Prague.
