Church Hatred Rife, Verein Members Told

Chicago—(RNS)—Delegates to the annual convention of the Catholic Central Verein ended their meetings here with the adoption of a declaration of principles which included the statement that "it is an obvious fact that prejudice and hatred against the Catholic Church still persists."

A resolution on intolerance contained in the declaration cited the following as "proof" of the existence of prejudice against the Church:

"The heated controversies aroused by such questions as the retaining of a representative of the President at Vatican City, 'Exaggerated and untrue claims of certain Protestant leaders in regard to separation of church and state, 'Released time for religious instruction, and the furnishing of school buses for children attending private schools."

World Indifference
The resolution charged that "the same tendencies of prejudice and unfairness prevail also in matters pertaining to our international policy."

"We regret, for instance," it said, "that while the opposition media in the affairs of Spain, little notice is given to abuses in Russia. The outstanding example of this prejudiced attitude has been demonstrated in the course of the past year by the indifference to the fate of Archbishop Stepanac and other victims of the Communist regime in Yugoslavia, a notoriously brutal government, which, nevertheless, has recently been exonerated by a self-constituted eight member commission of Americans."

In another resolution the Verein recognized that "organized labor, in some large measure, has come into its own and, in fact, is today one of the strongest factors in social, economic and political life."

However, the resolution added: "More than 40,000,000 Americans belong to unorganized, unskilled labor and the so-called white-collar workers have not shared in these material advantages. On the contrary, they have undergone a severe setback because income has not kept pace with the diminished buying power of the dollar. The same holds true of the middle class, the real backbone of a sound economic order, which is caught between the grinding stones of 'big business' and organized labor, and is in great danger of being wiped out."

The Verein met here jointly with its affiliate, the National Catholic Women's Union.

TITO'S REDS SLAY PRIEST

Rome—(Special)—A parish priest in Yugoslav-occupied Istria was beheaded Sunday by a mob of Slovene Communists, the Vatican has disclosed. Another priest was severely beaten.

The office of Msgr. Antonio Santini, Bishop of Trieste and Capodistria, issued a statement in Trieste charging that the slain priest, the Rev. Miro Buselitch of Lantschie, had been attacked with a large knife.

The statement said that the other cleric, Msgr. Jakob Ukmar, suffered severe skull fractures and other injuries and was in a critical condition. He is in a hospital in Trieste, which is now part of Yugoslavia.

The Bishop of Trieste himself was attacked by Slovene mob last June while he was touring Yugoslav-held towns in Zone B of Venezia Giulia and was permanently barred from that section, which is part of the territory in his ecclesiastical jurisdiction. He appointed Monsignor Ukmar as his episcopal delegate.

Monsignor Santini's statement said that Monsignor Ukmar was in a Lantschie school, about to confer 20 children, when a crowd of angry Slovenes, waving red flags and shouting what Vatican circles said were blasphemous epithets, broke into the classroom. The cleric barely managed to escape and take refuge in the parish priest's residence, according to the report.

A few minutes later, the statement said, the mob battered down the door of the residence and dragged Father Buselitch, who attempted to defend himself, into the street. Many youngsters stabbed him and one, brandishing a large knife, inflicted deep wounds in the neck.

Others in the priest's residence assaulted Msgr. Ukmar with sticks. The cleric, fell, unconscious, and the crowd trampled on him, the report went on.

As soon as he heard of the attacks Bishop Santini tried to send an ambulance to Lantschie, but Yugoslav authorities refused a transit permit, the statement said.

The assault was the climax of two days of anti-religious ferment in Lantschie, which started on Monsignor Ukmar's arrival Saturday, it was said.

As a comment on the incident, Vatican circles pointed to an editorial in *L'Osservatore Romano*, Vatican paper, that strongly criticized as "biased" statement, by a group of seven American Protestant clergymen who, after a visit to Yugoslavia, had said there was religious freedom in that country.

"The facts are so well known that any impartial person can judge correctly by himself," the newspaper said.

"No honest person can objectively and honestly say that some Protestant ministers have the necessary requisites to give a judgment of this kind," the editorial added.
