

30 Steelworkers Denounce Communism
 (Rochester, N. Y., Aug. 27) — A resolution of the 30th annual convention of the American Federation of Labor, held in New York City, denounces communism as a "worldwide menace to the peace and stability of the world." The resolution also states that the "American Federation of Labor is opposed to the infiltration of the labor movement by communists and to the use of force by labor unions to achieve their ends."

Saturday 'Nite Out' Trend Scored by Liturgical Group

(Rochester, N. Y., Aug. 27) — The trend of "Saturday night out" for the young people of the city is being scored by a group of liturgical workers. The group, which is part of the Liturgical Movement, is concerned with the proper celebration of the liturgy and the role of the laity in the church. They believe that the "Saturday night out" trend is a sign of a general decline in the religious life of the city.

Hungarian Bishops Protest State's Policy on Germans

(Budapest, Aug. 27) — The Hungarian bishops have made new protests to the government against the "indiscriminate" expulsion of Germans from Hungary. They also deplore that these Germans, many of whom are Catholics, are being deprived of their rights and property without any compensation. In a letter to Prime Minister Dinnyes the bishops recall that in 1944, they did everything in their power, through protests to the then existing government, to prevent the inhuman deportation of Jews. "Now we consider it necessary," they add, "in full recognition of our divine mandate, to protest against the deportation of Germans, especially since they are also Catholics."

Iron Curtain Bars S. H. Messenger

(New York, Aug. 27) — An iron curtain of censorship has been claimed down on "The Messenger of the Sacred Heart" in nine countries. They are: Albania, Bohemia, Rumania, Yugoslavia, Croatia, Lithuania, Poland and France. Fifty editions continue to be published in other parts of the world. Four editions of the magazine are published in the U. S. One in English, reaches more than 300,000 Catholic families. The others in the U. S. are published in German, Polish and Ukrainian. Three are published in Canada—one in English, one in French and one in Italian. "Kitchikaw Mith" Nine are published in India, two in France and Ireland (one in English and one in Gaelic).

State Convention Affirms Parochial School Bus Act

(New Brunswick, N. J., Aug. 27) — By a vote of 50 to 28, the Constitutional Convention agreed to insert in the New Jersey proposed constitution a provision that public funds may be used for the transportation of children to all schools, public or private. The convention thus affirmed the state's parochial school bus act, which was upheld last February by the U. S. Supreme Court in a five-to-four decision.
