Aquinas Eleven Bidding for National Fame Girds for Opener on Sept. 21.

With the toughest football schedule in Aquinas Institute history coming up and national honors in the offing, enthusiastic Rochester sport fans are eagerly awaiting the opening battle on Sunday afternoon, Sept. 21. The Irish will face Christian Brothers Academy of Syracuse in the opener at Red Wing Stadium.

Remembering the thrilling Detroit Central game of last year when 19,420 fans went wild, raving with excitement about the Aquinas brand of football, Coach Harry Wright and a husky squad of 33 seasoned players are planning greater thrills and more color for the eight-game schedule ahead.

THE AQUINAS SQUAD looked in excellent physical trim when they opened intensive practice sessions last week. Tanned and hard and eager, the Irish showed that they were ready for the long drills and rough scrimmages that Wright and Assistant Coach Neil Greese will drive them through in preparation for such opponents as Boys Town of Omaha, St. James of Port Arthur, Texas, Erie, Detroit Central, St. Mary's of Niagara Falls, St. Joe's and Canisius Prep of Buffalo.

Jimmy Ryan, first-string T formation quarterback, veteran of every game in '46, is sure starter in the Irish backfield. Other players fighting for a chance to carry the ball are Bill Grief, Johnny Della Villa, Johnny Farrell and Charley Malloy, a junior passing star, who is currently unable to drill because of a

slashed finger. Newcomers to the school from last year's Interscholastic League are Terry Sweeney, clever quarterback from East High, and Roddy Powers of West, who are certain to make Aquinas headlines this year.

THREE OUT-OF-TOWNERS who have come to Aquinas to wind up their high school studies and learn the Notre Dame system under Coach Wright, are earning favorable attention. Ed McCloskey from Iowa is a full back and punting artist while Paul Burns from Pennsylvania and 215-pound Bill Haggerty from Boston are husky line-men at guard and tackle.

Father Cyril Carter, C.S.B., faculty director of athletics, revealed that the Aquinas team will sport new uniforms of white nylon pants with maroon inserts, white jerseys with maroon stripes on the upper arm and white plastic helmets with maroon trim.

"We will be ready for big crowds," Father Carter said, "and are installing new bleachers in the stadium this week which will give us room for more than 19,000 at each game." To add to the big-time color of the Sunday games, the band and cheering sections which last year made such popular between-halves entertainment, are already practicing new stunts and marching musts.
