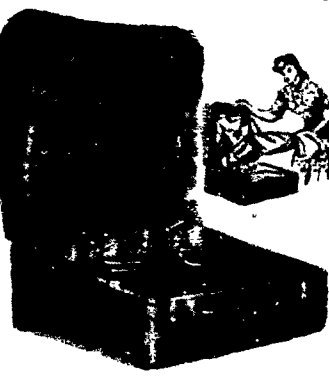

### Priest's Pamphlet Hits 'Jim Crowism'

St. Paul, Minn. (RNS) Sixty percent of Minnesota's white residents favor segregating Negroes in "Jim Crow" neighborhoods, according to a survey made for Gov. Luther W. Youngdahl's inter-racial commission and reported in a pamphlet written by the Rev. Francis J. Gilligan, of St. Paul Catholic Seminary here.

The pamphlet, entitled "The Negro and His Home in Minnesota," was published by the inter-racial commission, of which Father Gilligan is chairman.

One of the recommendations made by the commission after the survey was that the legislature should expand the present state law against restrictive covenants on a religious basis to include racial discrimination.

Directors will meet again about Nov. 1 in the Hotel Seneca, Mr. Courney said.

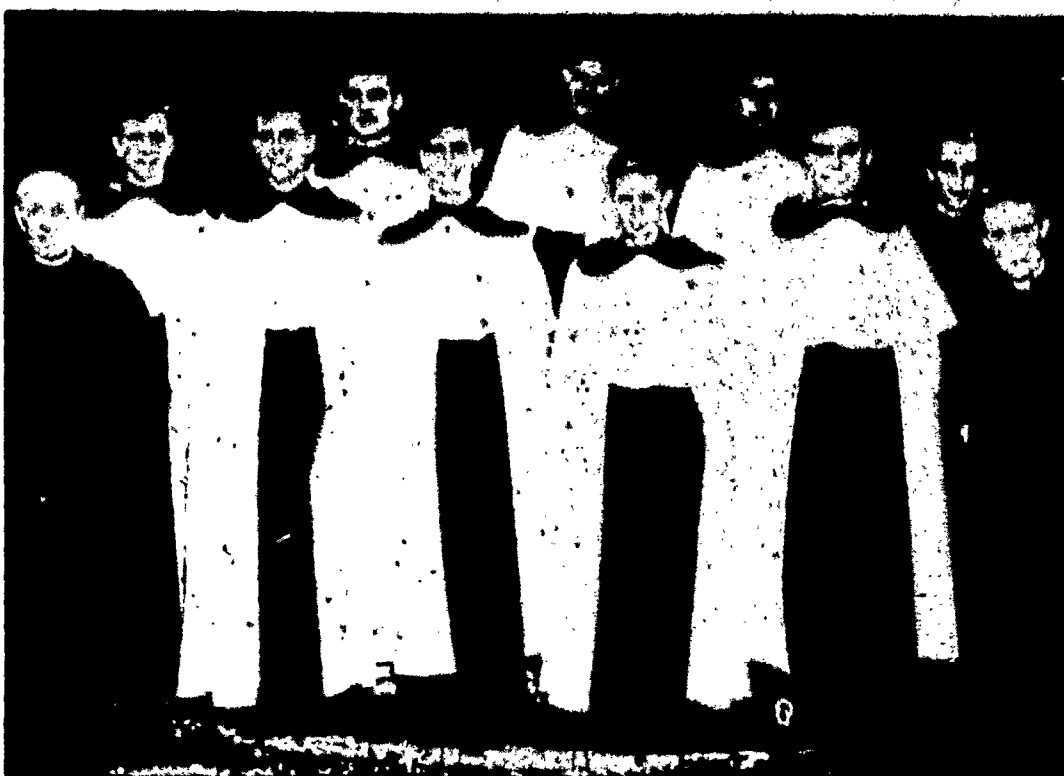

## 'Psychoanalysis' Topic Set For Msgr. Sheen in Auburn

Auburn — Rev. Fulton J. Sheen of the Catholic University of America will deliver a lecture entitled "Psychoanalysis and Psychoanalysis" in the Emerson Auditorium of East High School, Auburn, on Monday evening, September 22, at 8:15 p. m.

The world famous author, lecturer and orator is returning to Auburn for his sixth lecture under the auspices of the Lectum Players of St. Mary's Church.

Msgr. Sheen's address last year, entitled "The Sign of the Times," drew the largest audience in the history of the Emerson Auditorium.

The subject for this year's lecture is significant because of recent national publicity about psychiatry and religion in which Msgr. Sheen was widely criticized.

"I did not make any criticism of psychiatry nor of the psychoanalytical methods in general," Msgr. Sheen said in explaining the sense of his lecture series. "I am a spokesman for the Catholic Church when I say that any positive denial of sin on the part of Freudian psychoanalysis renders that science inadequate for the handling of problems which affect the whole man."

Tickets for the lecture are being distributed by a large committee headed by Miss Joan Seaton with Mrs. Carroll Caffrey and Miss Sarah Lyness as co-chairmen. They are also on sale at several downtown Auburn stores, at St. Mary's Rectory, and at Emerson Auditorium on the evening of the lecture.

A record crowd is expected to turn out for the presentation of the new Diocesan Boy Scout Troop to the Diocese, Bishop Kearney, Sunday afternoon, Sept. 14, at Edgewood Park.

The Boy Scout Rally, first public demonstration of scouting under Catholic auspices, was called to focus attention of the diocese on the great extension of scout activities in response to Bishop Kearney's request for full adoption of the movement.

David A. Murphy is chairman of the committee in charge of all arrangements for the rally. The event is sponsored jointly by the Diocesan Committee on Scouting and the executive of the Boy Scout Council of this area. There is from 2 to 4:30 p. m.
