Saint's Birth Noted in France

Paris — At Paray-le-Monial in Burgundy, where at the Convent of the Visitation lived St. Margaret Mary Alacoque and where she received the revelations of the Sacred Heart, feasts have been marking the third century of the birth of the saint in the neighborhood village of Verosvres.

The jubilee was opened with a Pontifical Mass celebrated by Bishop Paul Touze, Auxiliary of Paris, representing Cardinal Suhard, who has been in Rome in connection with the canonization of Catherine Laboure. Fifteen thousand women took part in a procession of the Blessed Sacrament. Other days will be especially for men and children.

Christ, appearing to St. Margaret Mary, revealed to her that He desired that a feast be kept in honor of His Sacred Heart and in reparation for man's ingratitude. From this beginning, devotion to the Sacred Heart became public and in time universal. St. Margaret Mary died on October 17, 1690, and was canonized in 1920. Her body rests in the Visitation Chapel at Paray-le-Monial.

Condemns Move for National Church

Budapest — (RNS) — Father Ignace Egoth, former secretary of state to President Zoltan Tildy, appealed to Hungarian authorities to stop the "irresponsible agitation" for a "National Catholic Church" in Hungary.

Addressing a political rally in Eger, Northern Hungary, Father Egoth, leader of the Independent Democratic Party, a Roman Catholic political group, denounced "disquieting propaganda" for abolition of Latin as the language of the Mass, and of the use of celibacy taken by priests.

He said another proposed "reform" was for a system of election to church offices by popular ballot.

Bucharest, Rumania (NC) — An expression of profound thanks by a group of students of the University of Bucharest here, on behalf of 2,600 students attending the university, has been addressed to Bishop Gerald P. O'Hara of Savannah, Georgia, regent of the Apostolic Nunciature in Rumania, for the gift of a large quantity of relief supplies sent to them through the generosity of American Catholics.

"The students of the University of Bucharest," the letter states, "profoundly touched by the expected generosity of American Catholic Action, ask Your Excellency to permit them to present to you their loyal, spontaneous and sincere acknowledgments, and request you to transmit their thanks to the general American donors."

Catholic Magazine Banned in Red Areas

New York — (RNS) — Nine Russian-dominated countries have banned The Messenger of the Sacred Heart, the Roman Catholic magazine and the official organ of the Apostleship of Prayer, according to the Rev. J. C. Faulkner, S.J., business manager of the American editions of the Messenger. The nine countries are: Yugoslavia, Albania, Poland, Austria, Latvia, Lithuania, Bohemia, Rumania and Croatia.

The Messenger, Father Faulkner said, is exclusively a devotional magazine and carries no discussions of secular problems. He added that its publication was banned in Yugoslavia in 1944, in Albania in 1945, and in Bohemia in 1938.
