Swiss Russia. Mr. Marshall is
particularly severe in his con-
demnation of Russia's recent use
of her veto power.
At the present time Russia
has invoked her veto privilege
twenty times against efforts of
the United Nations organiza-
tion to meet its responsibility
in preserving peace. Three
times, as Mr. Marshall states,
Russia has vetoed the efforts
of the UN Security Council to
deal with the Greek crisis.

THIS UNFORTUNATE de-
velopment has convinced Mr.
Marshall and other statesmen
that the veto power enjoyed by
the five permanent mem-
bers of the Security Council
must be revised.

This means that Mr. Marshall
and other statesmen now ap-
preciate what the Catholic teach-
ings of the United States saw
even before the United Nations
group was formally created at
the San Francisco Conference.
On the very eve of that con-
ference the Bishops warned
that granting a veto privilege
to the strong nations could
easily turn the United Nations
into nothing more than an old-
fashioned power alliance. In
the short space of two years
we have seen the prediction of
the Bishops come true.

ORIGINALLY, THE Bishops
and others would that they
had been heeded—saw another
dangerous possibility in the
veto privilege. They pointed
out that a satellite nation could
carry on aggressive warfare
and still be immune from any
disciplinary action by the
United Nations by reason of
the protective patronage of a
great nation enjoying the veto
privilege.

This is exactly what has hap-
pened. As Mr. Marshall points
out, the Soviet-sponsored gov-
ernments of Albania, Yugo-
slavia and Bulgaria, in open
violation of international law,
are conspiring against the
Greek government by render-
ing assistance to the Greek
guerrillas.

But Russia's exercise of the
veto has blocked UN efforts to
discipline the guilty satellite
nations.

THE UNITED NATIONS is
a very necessary organization.
But it cannot succeed if might
instead of right continues to
dominate its affairs. Law,
moral law, must become the
rule of conduct if the world is
to have peace and the United
Nations is to succeed.

The only sane way to decide
conflicts among nations—and
Catholic authorities continually
insist upon this point—is to
have recourse to the laws of
justice. It is immoral to per-
mit any nation, despite its pow-
er or prestige, to have a veto
over the dictates of law and
justice.

To permit Russia or any
other nation a veto privilege
over the affairs of the United
Nations is equivalent to grant-
ing a gangster veto rights over
the lawful decision of a na-
tion's courts or legislature.

ALL THIS Mr. Marshall now
apparently understands. More
important our government is
beginning to speak the truth
publicly.

injustice," says Griffiths de-
clared. "If the Ten Command-
ments are regarded as a collec-
tion of Hebrew taboos, if the
Sermon on the Mount and the
Beatitudes constitute no positive,
eternally true norm of justice,
if they represent no divinely com-
posed symphony of justice and
mercy if the whole New Testa-
ment is but the visionary preach-
ments of the effeminate Apostles
of the pallid Christ, then might
and Hitler was right, and Stalin
is right, and the purge is right,
and the concentration camp is right,
and sterilization and confiscation,
and all the abominations of total-
itarianism are right, and democ-
racy is an unrealistic farce!"

Milford, Ont.—(CNS)—The
cornerstone for the reconstruct-
ed historic Fort St. Marie, which
is linked with the missionary
work of the early Canadian Jesuit
martyrs, was blessed here by
His Eminence James Cardinal
McGulgan, Archbishop of Toronto,
in ceremonies which were
also attended by the two other
British Commonwealth cardinals.

The blessing took place follow-
ing a Pontifical Mass at the in-
ternationally known shrine. The
celebrant was His Eminence Ber-
nard Cardinal Griffin, Archbishop
of Westminster. The sermon
was delivered by His Eminence
Norman Cardinal Gilroy, Arch-
bishop of Sydney, Australia. Car-
dinal McGulgan assisted in the
Sanctuary.

The shrine church was packed
and hundreds were unable to gain
admittance. Father T. J. Lally,
S.J., director of the martyr's
shrine, in welcoming the three
cardinals said it was the first
time such a signal honor had
been paid to the historic site.

Franco Medal
Offered to Pope

Vitoria, Spain.—At a cere-
mony held to bestow upon Gen-
eral Franco the first "Francisco
de Vitoria" medal, created by the
Municipality of this city on the
fourth centenary of the eminent
Dominican monk, the Chief
of State asked the mayor to offer
the original medal first to His
Holiness Pope Pius XII.

Franco said he would accept
the duplicate. The medal is in-
tended as a reward for great
services in behalf of peace and
international justice.
