

Msgr. Sheen and Jordan Slated on Culture Talks

Max Jordan, European correspondent for the N.Y. News Service and the Catholic Courier, will highlight the program for the new Christian Culture Series at Aquinas Institute.

Mr. Jordan, who was N.Y. European director for ten years, will appear in Rochester, Feb. 8. His topics will be "We Lost the West in Europe."

The 1943 Christian Culture Series will be opened on the sixth time by the Rev. Msgr. Fulton J. Sheen of Catholic University, Friday, Oct. 3. Monologues will discuss "Psychic Analysis and Psychosynthesis."

Reds in Hungary Posed As Friends of Catholics

New York — (NC) — Reports received here from Hungary reveal extraordinary pre-election efforts on the part of Hungarian Communists to pose as "friends" of the Church and, by clever tactics, to weaken the opposition of the 10 per cent Catholic people of Hungary to Communism and all it stands for.

Thousands of copies of a photograph, showing Matthias Rakosi, Hungarian Communist leader, shaking hands with a Catholic priest at some insignificant occasion, were distributed throughout the country.

The formerly unceasing attacks on priests, Catholic institutions and organizations suddenly stopped and were replaced by avowals of friendship for the church.

Leading Communists offered to serve as godfathers at the christening of children, particularly of peasant families, and the photographs taken at such occasions are skillfully exploited by Communist propaganda.

Matthias Rakosi, much to everybody's surprise, declared his opposition to the plan for official religious teaching declaring the plan an "inconsiderate and irresponsible action" which must hurt "the religious feelings of the people."

These anomalies, and similar ones, for a time caused a certain amount of confusion, until it became clear that they reflected not a change of heart, but merely a change of tactics. "Communists realized," the reports declare, "that Hungarian Catholicism, even in its present depressed state, represents great strength in Hungarian public life."

Catholics are not deceived by such tactics, the report continues, which cannot hide the fact that Hungary's Communists are determined to "continue in the future the present exclusion of Hungary's Catholics — in other words, of 70 per cent of the population — from social movements and to deprive them of basic liberties, including the freedom of association, assembly, opinion, press and propaganda."

Communists want to confine the church to the four walls of the sanctuary, and as soon as Catholics try to step out into public life "they are immediately confronted with the irreconcilable resistance of the opposite side," the reports state.

"This is the truth, despite the seemingly favorable concessions of the changed tactics," the reports say in conclusion. "However, as Hungarian Catholic opinion well knows and clearly sees through these tactics, they will fail and will decide no one, except, perhaps, the uninformed public of foreign countries."

St. Anne Beaupre Jubilee Marked

Quebec—Impressive and colorful ceremonies were held here today to commemorate the diamond jubilee of the Solemn Consecration of St. Anne's shrine in the internationally famous shrine of St. Anne de Beaupre.

The rituals opened with a Solemn Pontifical Mass offered by Bishop Georges Leon Pelletier, Auxiliary of Quebec, who has been named Bishop of Three Rivers. Following the Mass was a procession in which the two crowns—one for St. Anne, the other for the Blessed Mother—used in the ceremony 60 years ago, were carried by a delegation of the Ladies of St. Anne.

The crowns are studded with precious stones and were the work of the celebrated Dutch goldsmith van Ryswick of Antwerp. Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament and the chanting of a solemn Te Deum followed the procession.

It was on September 14, 1887, that the late Cardinal Elzear Taschereau, long devoted to St. Anne, acted as representative of Pope Leo XIII in crowning the statue of the saint at the shrine where she has been honored for 200 years.

Msgr. Swanstrom Elevated by Pope

New York — (NC) Msgr. Edward E. Swanstrom, executive director of War Relief Services National Catholic Welfare Conference, has been elevated to the rank of Domestic Prelate with the title of Right Reverend Monsignor van Ryswick of Antwerp. Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament and the chanting of a solemn Te Deum followed the procession.

The elevation marked the second time within a year that Monsignor Swanstrom has been honored by the Holy Father for his work in the relief field. He was named a Papal Chamberlain with the title of Very Reverend Monsignor by the Pope last November. Monsignor Swanstrom has served with War Relief Services N.C.W.C. for almost five years.
