14,000 Japanese Hear Jesuit Lectures on Faith

New York — (NC) — Father John Laures, S.J., of the Catholic University in Tokyo has just completed a year of weekly lectures for Japanese students. In all he has given 35 lectures to 14,000 listeners in nine universities. During the year Father Laures also lectured at 20 other schools, private circles and societies.

In his lectures, Father Laures demonstrates that the fear of the Japanese people for Christianity is based on prejudices fostered by the sales historians of the Tokyo newspaper.
