St. Mary's Falls Vets to Face Powerhouse Of Aquinas Sunday in Second Stadium Tilt

Harry Wright's powerful Aquinas football aggregation will try for their second straight victory Sunday afternoon when they stack up against St. Mary's team from Niagara Falls in Rochester's Red Wing Stadium.

Roy Rigney, St. Mary's coach, will bring to Rochester a team of vets who boast an undefeated record for 1947. Their closest call came when Aquinas held them to a 0-0 tie. This year the Niagara boys are off to an impressive start. In the first game they beat the Alumni 19-0. Last week they overhauled St. Jerome's of Ontario 40-0.

The vaunted team which Harry Wright led Sunday in the opener against C.S.A. of Syracuse lived up to its previous reputation as one of the most powerful high school teams in the country.

IN THEIR INITIAL start the Dewey Avenue boys outclassed the Syracuse side before 13,000 fans. The final result, 30-0 in favor of Aquinas, could have been greater if Coach Wright had not relieved the situation by pulling out his first stringers and running in almost his entire 50-man squad.

Against St. Mary's this Sunday Aquinas will use the same starting line. Paul Tschetter, Aquinas right tackle, has been named captain for Sunday's contest. Officials will be Howie Freckleton, Don Lyons, Carl Chamberlain and Barney Smith.
